The County Courthouse

The Redwood County Commissioners are faced with a very difficult decision when it comes to providing modern day security in our courthouse that is over a century in age. In a building with walls over three (3) feet thick, the idea of upgrading to modern day technologies is a real challenge. Over the years,

wires have been strung virtually everywhere and are a tangled maze in an attempt to provide the modern day technologies needed to perform our jobs.

The heating system in the building is over sixty (60) years old and still in operation.

Every year, at minimum, \$3,000 is spent in upkeep, hoping it will run for another year. Winter heat and summer cold air virtually flows out of the uninsulated attic. There are 9 foot & 14 foot windows with glass block, which are cemented in the frame and provide little to no energy efficiencies. Contractors indicated it would take a full day to remove and replace one (1) window. There is a minimally adequate fire alarm system in the building.

These items are miniscule in comparison to the real issue at hand. SECURITY. For you, our citizens. For the employees

who work in the building each and every day. For the citizens serving as jurors. For all of our law enforcement officials walking/ transporting inmates out in the open from the jail to the courtroom, and attempting to maintain safety and order when attorneys, witnesses, victims, criminals, and family members, are all cramped and comingled in the same area awaiting their time in court.

Think of all the recent

tragedies occurring in our public facilities across the nation. The purpose of government is to provide for the health. safety and welfare of its public. The condition of the Redwood County Courthouse does not provide safety that necessary in today's

world. The County Board has been working on a solution for the past several years and with the most recent design, which addresses the security on the top floor only of the Court House, has a price tag in excess of \$4 Million. That price does not account for any of the unknowns, which always happen in a renovation project, especially in a building of its age. That price does not upgrade the heating and cooling system, electrical, IT/phone and the list continues on. That price does not address moving the inmates from the jail to the courthouse in a secure manner.



Our courthouse is not eligible to be on the Historic Register to access any funding from the state for historic renovations, due to the many alterations done over the years by past leadership. Everything we do to the courthouse must be paid by you, the taxpayers of Redwood County. Do you want to continue to pour money into a structure that has outlived its useful life? At what cost is too much and building new is the wiser option?

Please contact your County Commissioners and express your thoughts and concerns. They want to hear from you and value your input. Saying nothing now cannot change what is done in the future.

Even though we are sentimental about our landmarks, there comes a point in time when it is no longer feasible to expend what it takes to retrofit a 125 + year old building to our modern day needs.

Sometimes they just can't be saved. The harsh reality is that it all comes down to your tax dollars. Where do you really want your money spent?

Redwood County Purchases Former Titan Machinery Building for Highway Department



On April 17 the Redwood County Board of Commissioners



unanimously approved a purchase agreement for the former Titan Building in Redwood Falls. The building will replace the County's current Highway Department Building. The existing highway building was constructed nearly 60 years ago. It has served the County well, but

is rapidly deteriorating. It would require a very expensive remodel project to remain useable. In addition, today's large trucks and motor graders used by the highway department no longer fit in the existing building.

The former Titan Building was constructed in 2013. The main building has 39,000 square feet. It includes 8400 square feet of office and 24,000 square feet of heated vehicle repair and storage as well as parts storage areas. In addition the site has an unheated 11,000 square foot storage building.

Redwood County was given the opportunity to purchase the \$5.2 Million building for \$2.2 Million due to a lease buyout negotiated with the current long term lease holder. The County plans to sell the land where the existing building resides to recoup some of the new building investment cost.

Coming in 2018/2019:

Redwood County successfully received a grant from Greater Minnesota Regional Parks and Trails Commission in the amount of \$301,435. This money is going towards the construction of 6 camper cabins, 8 primitive campsites, 2 new vault toilets, a self-serve kayak/paddleboard rental station, an accessibility trail, and improved gravel access roads.



Buffer Reminder

All 103E Public Ditches must have a 16.5 ft. buffer in place by November 1, 2018. If you have any questions, please call the Redwood County Environmental Office (507) 637-4023, or the Redwood Soil and Water Conservation District (507) 637-2427.

Also, please make note that the installation of a buffer under the buffer law does not make that land available for public use (hunting).

Actions Required by MN Law

to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species:

- Clean aquatic plants, zebra mussels, and other prohibited invasive species off watercraft, trailers, and equipment before leaving the water access.
- Drain water from boat, ballast tanks, portable bait container, and motor before leaving a water access – and drain bilge, livewell, and baitwell by removing drain plugs. Keep drain plugs out while transporting boats.
- Dispose of unwanted bait in the trash. It is illegal to release live bait into the water, or to dump worms on the ground.

Notes from the Assessor's Office

Around the 20th of March you should have received envelope from Redwood County containing your 2018 property tax statement based on the classification and value placed as of January 2, 2017. Also in that envelope is your 2018 Valuation Notice which will be used for 2019 taxes. Review vour Valuation Notice for the classification and value of your parcel as of January 2, 2018. The Valuation Notice also lists the date and time for the local Board of Appeal and Equalization meeting which gives all property owners the opportunity to discuss value and classification concerns with local officials.

The Assessor's Office has of the responsibility placing a classification and value on every parcel in the county. There four main classification are groups: Agricultural, Residential, Commercial, and Exempt. The classification with the most parcels in Redwood County is Agricultural.

For 2018 values, agricultural land had a reduction of 2 to 4 percent. Commercial properties had some increases. Residential properties increased depending on the district they are located in.

Minnesota Statutes, section 273.13, subdivision 23, provides a number of requirements that *must* be met in order to be classified as class 2a land: (class 2a land is agricultural).

1. At least 10 contiguous acres must be used to produce agricultural products in the preceding year (or be qualifying land enrolled in an eligible conservation program, or be used for intensive livestock or poultry confinement);

- 2. The agricultural products are defined by statute; and
- 3. The agricultural product must be produced for sale.

When the parcel contains the home of the property owner and there is less than 10 additional acres that qualify for the 2a agricultural classification, the parcel will be reviewed. Parcels classified as agricultural in the past may now be classified as residential. A change from agricultural to residential will affect the due date of taxes in 2019. If your parcel is affected by a classification change and you have additional agricultural land that you or a qualifying relative farm on your behalf, you may still qualify for agricultural homestead on your agricultural land by applying for Special Ag homestead. Ludwig has been teaching area 4-H youth the skills that go along with shooting everything from a bow to a .22 rifle for several years, and in that time hundreds of those youth have been impacted by his dedication to them and the program.



Ludwig was announced as a recipient of the award in early December and received a plaque and further recognition from the University of Minnesota Extension Service during the January 16 Redwood County board meeting.

Ludwig was nominated for the award by Stacy Johnson, Redwood County 4-H program coordinator, with letters of support being provided from those who have been impacted by his service.



Marriage Licenses

As spring and summer approach, wedding season begins. A marriage license may be obtained from the recorder's office for a fee of \$115.

There are many different non-traditional ceremonies which are popular right now. choose to have a friend perform your marriage ceremony, that is now possible. A person will just need to become an ordained officiant through the web. This person will receive a certificate of ordination which will need to be recorded in the Recorder's office prior to performing a marriage ceremony. There is no fee to record this ordination certificate, however, there is a short form which will need to be completed. Once this certificate has been filed, you may perform marriages throughout the State of Minnesota.



Remember to Get Your Permit!

Don't forget that the construction of any new or replacement structure, or the construction of any addition to any existing structure, in rural Redwood County requires a permit from the Redwood County Environmental Office. "Construction" includes moving in a prefabricated or prebuilt building from offsite or from a different location on the same property.

You can stop in at the Environmental Office, in the Redwood County Government Center in Redwood Falls, on weekdays between 8 am and 4:30 pm to apply. The process takes about 15 to 30 minutes. You will need to know the proposed location, cost, and dimensions of the building – including total height to the peak of the roof. You will also need to indicate the location of any wells and septic systems or septic holding tanks on the property. All permit applications must include a site plan signed by the landowner.

Permit applications are also available on the Redwood County Environmental Office Website (Land Use/Zoning Permit Application).



Beacon Online GIS

Redwood County is continuing its efforts to increase access to public information in a user friendly fashion. There is now a free online mapping tool which allows residents to view parcel boundary lines, county ditch systems, high resolution imagery and other unique layers.

While access to the Beacon site is free to use, the county does have a subscription level giving users additional tools such as: comparable property search, creating multiple address mailing labels, and viewing locations from multiple angles (via Pictometry ®).

Ordinance Hearings

The Environmental Office has prepared proposed revisions to the Redwood County Zoning Ordinance. The proposed revisions, and a brief "bullet-point" summary thereof, are available for review at the Environmental Office, in the Redwood County Government Center. They are also available on the Redwood County Environmental Office Website.

A public informational open house was held on March 28th, in the Wabasso Community Center. to answer questions and gather public. information from the Additional public meetings will be held before the Planning Commission and the County Board of Commissioners, before any changes are made to the Ordinance. Notification of these meeting times and dates will be published in the Redwood Gazette, and other local newspapers, and will be mailed to all city clerks and township board clerks, once the times and dates have been set.

The reason for the ordinance revisions is to streamline the process, eliminate conflicting and repetitious provisions, update the ordinances with new information, and address common public complaints about land use.
