The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session at 8:30 a.m. in the Commissioners' Room in the Government Center, Redwood Falls, Minnesota.

Present for all or portions of the meeting were Commissioners Dennis Groebner, Lon Walling, Bob Van Hee, Jim Salfer, and Dave Forkrud. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

- On motion by Van Hee, second by Walling, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Business Development Grant Agreements for Bar RL Performance Horses, Brake Away Trailers and Auto Care, Chapter 2, Hilltop Harvest Strawberry Farm, Lightfoot Heating and Cooling, My Kupcake Factory, Red Rock Chiropractor Center, Stephens Funeral Service; Stichin' It Up Quilt Shop, Tender Loving Childcare and Z's Bees & Apple Trees. It shall be noted that two County employees were awarded a grant but all guidelines and processes were followed completely.
- On motion by Forkrud, second by Van Hee, in a 4-1 vote with Groebner voting nay, the Board voted to approve the Tax Forfeited/Blight Removal Policy.
- On motion by Walling, second by Forkrud, the Board voted unanimously to direct Mumme to send the Tax Forfeited/Blight Removal Policy to the City of Revere for consideration of tax forfeited/blight removal funds to be awarded per the approved policy.

KERKHOFF AUCTION AND REAL ESTATE

- Kerkhoff presented options for the sale of the 108 acre parcel of farmland, Parcel ID #63-007-4040.
- On motion by Walling, second by Groebner, the Board voted unanimously to approve the 108 acre farmland be surveyed by Bueltel & Moseng in the amount of \$1,200.00.
- On motion by Walling, second by Forkrud, to exercise the Out Clause in the Farmland Lease Agreement if the land sells at auction. The motion failed by a vote of 0-5.

- On motion by Walling, second by Van Hee, with Groebner abstaining due to a conflict of interest, the Board voted to approve the bill from Turbes Ag Sales in the amount of \$97.00.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

WHEREAS, Michael Curley's 4- year term as a Commissioner on the Red Rock Rural Water System ("RRRWS") Board of Commissioners is scheduled to expire at midnight on December 31, 2019; and

WHEREAS, Jake Takle's 4-year term as a Commissioner on the RRRWS Board of Commissioners is scheduled to expire at midnight on December 31, 2019; and
