



CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT BETWEEN REDWOOD COUNTY AND THE CITY OF REDWOOD FALLS FOR CSAH 1 AND CSAH 24

WHEREAS, the City is developing the Reflection Ridge Business Park and the Reflection Prairie Addition adjacent to County State Aid Highway ("CSAH") 1 and CSAH 24 (hereinafter the "Development"); and

WHEREAS, the City will install right turn lanes and left turn bypass lanes for all entrances constructed off of CSAH 1 and CSAH 24 (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the County requires this Project for corridor consistency, to ensure roadway safety and operations, and to reduce crash potential; and

WHEREAS, through this Agreement the City and County wish to establish the duties and responsibilities of both parties before, during, and after construction of the Development and the Project; and

WHEREAS, through this Agreement the City and the County wish to define annual and long term maintenance, construction and reconstruction duties and responsibilities on or along CSAH 1 and CSAH 24 within the City limits.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and understandings contained herein, the County and City enter into the following Agreement:

AGREEMENT

1. <u>TERM OF AGREEMENT:</u> The term of this Agreement shall commence on the Effective Date, and shall not terminate until a new agreement is accepted by both parties in writing.

2. SCOPE OF WORK AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF EACH PARTY:

- a. As part of the Development and Project, the City agrees to:
 - Complete construction of the Project right turn lane and left turn bypass lane driving surfaces at each entrance or access point of Phase 1 by September 1, 2027, and final construction restoration by October 31, 2027;
 - ii. Be responsible for all engineering, construction and administrative expenses relating to the Project, including: project management, design, permit acquisition, right-of-way acquisition, utility relocation, bidding, survey, construction, construction inspection and contract administration;
 - iii. Design the Project to minimum standards set forth in Exhibit A, Turn Lane and Bypass Lane Design Guidance and applicable State Aid Design Guidance to allow for the use of Municipal State Aid Street ("MSAS") funding of the improvements:
 - iv. Complete the Project construction plans, specifications and acquire any necessary right-ofway by October 2026;

- v. Notify the County upon substantial completion of the Project and allow the County 14 days to review the site for compliance with the plan construction standards. The City must address any County punch list items prior to closing the construction contract; and
- vi. Provide a copy of the construction as-built plans to the County upon completion of the Project.
- b. The City agrees to the following Post-Project Responsibilities:
 - i. The City will complete construction of additional turn lanes and bypass lanes for each new entrance or access point added to the Development after Phase 1, as shown on the approved Plat.
 - ii. The City will not allow private connections to CSAH 1 and CSAH 24 within either Development, unless it is determined necessary and both parties agree in writing as an amendment to this Agreement.
 - iii. The City will install and maintain water mains, sewer mains and all house connections for both sewer and water. All future utility repairs or replacements require a full depth street section repair to match in-place conditions. Should the City fail to properly replace the street section and surface, it is hereby agreed that the County will have the work done and the City hereby agrees to pay for said work within 30 days of receipt of invoice.
 - iv. The City will maintain ownership of water main or sewer pipe abandoned in the ground and pay for all costs associated with any filling and bulkheading or removal of said water main or sewer pipe in the future.
 - v. In any portion of the City which is not built up, where it is mutually agreed curb and gutter is not needed, permit side ditches within the right of way at least two feet deep and four feet wide at the bottom.
 - vi. The City will construct and maintain all culverts and crossings across such ditches.
 - vii. The City will maintain and/or remove all trees along the roadway in boulevard areas.
 - viii. The City will be responsible for removing snow by hauling on or along CSAH 1 and CSAH 24 at its' own expense if an urban section is constructed in the future.
 - ix. The City will be responsible for lawn mowing and lawn maintenance of boulevard grass if an urban section is constructed in the future.
 - x. On this Development, Project and future construction projects along CSAH 1 and CSAH 24, if mutually agreed on the need to install, the City will pay for all construction and maintenance costs for curb and gutter, sewer, storm sewer, catch basins and public utilities. The City will maintain and replace the storm sewer system after initial construction, including annual cleaning of storm sewer system.
 - xi. If mutually agreed on the need to install, the City will construct, maintain and replace sidewalk and trails, and will be responsible for all maintenance including snow plowing and removal.
 - xii. If mutually agreed on the need to install, the City will pay for installation and maintenance of intersection lighting at Development access points, including all electric payments, bulb replacements, painting, pole maintenance and replacement, pole knockdowns, locates and relocations.
 - xiii. The City will complete no work of any sort on County right-of-way, before the plans for work have been submitted and approved by County Engineer.
- c. As part of the Project, the County agrees to:
 - i. Review and approve the Project plans;
 - ii. Be responsible for costs of its' staff time as it relates to this Project;
 - iii. Write a utility relocation memo if needed to support Project utility relocation requirements;
 - iv. Support Project right-of-way acquisition through eminent domain proceedings, if needed; and

- v. Review the Project upon substantial construction completion and within 14 days provide punch list items needing correction to the City.
- d. The County agrees to the following Post-Project Responsibilities:
 - i. On properly authorized future projects on or along CSAH 1 and CSAH 24, to pay out any available eligible funds provided (federal, state aid, or local) for the costs of eligible storm sewer, grading, subgrade correction, base and bituminous work, for the full width of the street, between curb and gutter lines as established, but not including the curb and gutter.
 - ii. Pay all costs of routine roadway maintenance, including chip sealing, patching and snowplowing the driving lanes and turn lanes, excluding removing snow by hauling on or along CSAH 1 and CSAH 24 if an urban section is constructed in the future as provided herein.
 - iii. Conduct full right-of-way width roadside ditch mowing every three years and yearly shoulder top cuts within the time frames allowed by Minn. Stat. 160.232.
 - iv. Complete no work of any sort, except routine roadway maintenance, before the plans for work have been submitted and approved by the City.

4. GENERAL PROVISIONS.

- a. Liability: Each party is solely responsible for its own acts or omissions associated with the tasks and deliverables covered by this Agreement. The liability of Local Government is governed by Minn. Stat. Chapter 466 and other applicable law.
- b. Indemnity: The parties agree to indemnify and hold harmless one another from any liability, claims, losses, damages, costs, judgments, or expenses, including reasonable attorneys' and other professional fees, resulting directly or indirectly from any negligent, tortious or illegal act or omission by the other party (including its officers, employees, agents and subcontractors) arising from the terms of this Agreement, and against all loss by reason of the failure of the either party, its agents, employees or subcontractors fully to perform all obligations under this Agreement. For clarification and not by way of limitation, this obligation to indemnify and hold harmless shall apply to all materials prepared or furnished pursuant to this Agreement, including, without limitation, the unlawful disclosure or use of protected data, the work to complete the Project, and the subsequent maintenance and use of the completed Project area. The terms and provisions of this Section shall survive the expiration, suspension or termination of this Agreement

- c. Audit: Under Minnesota Statutes §16C.05, subdivision 5, the books, records, documents and accounting procedures and practices of County and Municipality relevant to this Agreement are subject to examination by State and the Legislative Auditor for a minimum of six years.
- d. Jurisdiction and Venue: Minnesota Law governs the validity, interpretation and enforcement of this Agreement. Venue for all legal proceedings arising out of this agreement, or its breach, must be in Redwood County, Minnesota.
- e. Government Data Practices: The parties must comply with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minn. Stat. Ch. 13, as it applies to all data provided by under this agreement, and as it applies to all data created, collected, received, stored, used, maintained, or disseminated by the parties under this agreement. The civil remedies of Minn. Stat. § 13.08 apply to the release of the data referred to in this clause by either of the parties.

f. Assignment and Amendments:

- Assignment. Neither party may assign nor transfer any rights or obligations under this
 Agreement without the prior consent of the other party and a fully executed Assignment
 Agreement, executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved this
 Agreement, or their successors in office.
- ii. Amendments. Any amendment to this Agreement must be in writing and will not be effective until it has been executed and approved by the same parties who executed this original Agreement, or their successors in office.

g. Waiver; Agreement Complete:

- i. Waiver. If a party fails to enforce any provision of this contract that failure does not waive the provision or the party's right to subsequently enforce it.
- ii. Contract Complete. This Agreement contains all negotiations and agreements between the parties. No other understanding regarding this contract, whether written or oral, may be used to bind either party.
- h. Severability. In the event that any portion of this Agreement shall be held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Agreement.
- i. Execution. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and to constitute one and the same instrument. Electronic copies of this Agreement, including without limitation, those transmitted by facsimile or scanned to an image file, shall be considered originals.


TURN LANE AND BYPASS LANE DESIGN GUIDANCE

Project design guidance for right turn lane and left turn bypass lane development on CSAH 1 and CSAH 24 at the Development access points follows:

- a) Roadway design speed: 55mph
- b) Roadway thru lane width: 12' with 1' paved shoulder and 5' aggregate shoulder
- c) Subcut 2' in road core areas where widen, to the bottom of muck/organics if present.
- d) 4:1 slopes at all locations (inslopes and backslopes).
- e) Ditch bottoms: 4' wide minimum, maintain ditch special grades.
- f) Geotextile fabric type 5 under aggregate base.
- g) Aggregate Base Class 5: 12" thickness.
- h) Bituminous: 8" thick, 4 lifts. 2" SPWEA340C, 2" SPWEB340C, 4" SPNWB330B.
 - o Bituminous tack coat between all lifts.
- i) Cross slopes: 0.02 lanes, 0.04 shoulders.
- j) Striping: 6" latex edge lines.
- k) Bypass and turn lane signs: all new.
- 1) Driveways and field entrances:
 - o 6:1 slopes.
 - o 18" pipe where needed (minimum size)
 - o No spiral CSP.
- m) Shoulder base aggregate class 1 on CSAH 1 and CSAH 24
- n) Erosion Control:
 - o Category 3N blanket (rapid stabilization method 4 / Category 25) or equivalent
- o) Roadside seed mix
- p) Traffic Control: Required.

During construction of Project, the City must ensure the following occurs:

- 1. MnDOT certified inspector must observe and inspect Project construction.
- 2. Turn lanes and bypass lanes must be constructed to State Aid standards.
- 3. Subgrade and aggregate must be compacted to 100% density within the road core and test rolling must occur prior to construction of aggregate base and bituminous surfaces.
- 4. Bituminous density disincentives apply per MnDOT Construction Specifications.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

DIVISION A SPECIAL PROVISIONS

A-1 (1208) PROPOSAL GUARANTY

No proposal guaranty will be required.

A-2 INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR STATUS

Contractor is to be and shall remain an independent contractor with respect to any and all work performed under this Contract. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as creating the relationship of co-partners, joint ventures, or an association, nor shall the Contractor, be considered an employee, agent or representative of the County. Contractor acknowledges and agrees that Contractor is not entitled to receive any of the benefits received by Redwood County employees and is not eligible for workers' or unemployment compensation benefits under Redwood County.

A-3 INDEMNIFICATION

Any and all claims that arise or may arise against Contractor, its agents, servants or employees as a consequence of any act or omission on the part of Contractor or its agents, servants or employees while engaged in the performance of the Contract shall in no way be the responsibility or obligation of the County. Contractor shall indemnity, hold harmless and defend the County, its officers and employees against any and all liability, loss, costs, damages, expenses, claims or actions, including attorney's fees which the County its officers or employees may hereinafter sustain, incur or be required to pay, arising out of or by reason of any act or omission of the Contractor, its subcontractors, partners, independent contractors, its agents, servants or employees, in the execution, performance or failure to adequately perform Contractor's obligations pursuant to this Contract. This indemnification obligation shall not be limited in any way by the insurance coverages required under this Contract. Nothing in this Contract shall constitute a waiver by the County of any statute of limitations or exceptions on liability.

A-4 INSURANCE

The Contractor's insurance shall be primary for all claims related to its contractual obligations. Contractor shall procure and maintain for the duration of the Contract, insurance coverage for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder by Contractor.

A. CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE:

Contractor shall furnish an original Certificate of Insurance as evidence of required coverage to Redwood County before work commences.

A person authorized by the insurer to bind coverage should sign the Certificate.

The Certificate should include a minimum 60-day written notice of intent to cancel, suspend or reduce coverage.

The Certificate should identify Redwood County as an Additional Insured for relevant coverages, except workers' compensation.

Insurance shall be placed with insurers reasonably acceptable to Redwood County.

General Liability coverage (occurrence form CG 00 01 or a substitute form providing equivalent coverage), and shall cover liability arising from premises, operations, independent contractors, products-completed operations, personal injury, advertising, and liability assumed under an insured contract (including the tort liability (if applicable) of another assumed in a business contract).

B. COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY COVERAGE:

The minimum limits of liability should be:

\$1,000,000 Annual Aggregate

\$1,000,000 Personal Injury

\$1,000,000 Each Occurrence

\$ 5,000 Medical Expense

C. AUTO LIABILITY COVERAGE:

The minimum limits of liability should be:

Bodily Injury: \$1,000,000 per person/\$1,000,000 per occurrence

Property Damage: \$1,000,000 each occurrence, OR a Combined Single Limit: \$1,000,000 per occurrence.

Auto coverage should include: Any Auto, including Hired and Non-Owned. Automobile Liability coverage shall be written on ISO form CA 00 01, CA 00 05, CA 00 12, CA 00 20, or substitute for providing equivalent liability coverage. Such insurance shall cover liability arising out of any auto (including owned, hired, and non-owned autos).

Note: Auto coverage should be waived only when the contractor's work under the contract clearly does not involve the use of an automobile.

D. UMBRELLA LIABILITY COVERAGE:

An umbrella liability policy may be used in conjunction with primary coverage limits to meet the minimum limit requirements for each coverage.

Redwood County should be listed as an Additional Insured.

E. WORKERS' COMPENSATION AND EMPLOYER'S LIABILITY COVERAGE:

Workers' Compensation as required by the State of Minnesota, and Employer's Liability insurance. If the Contractor's employment is an excluded employment under Minn. Stat. § 176.041 and the Contractor elects not to purchase workers' compensation coverage, the Contractor shall provide the County with a written waiver of workers' compensation coverage in a form acceptable to the County. The Contractor agrees that under no circumstances shall the County be responsible for workers' compensation for injuries suffered in connection with this Contract.

F. DEDUCTIBLES AND SELF-INSURANCE:

Any deductibles will be the sole responsibility of the Contractor and may not exceed \$50,000 without the written consent of the County. Any request for a higher deductible must first be approved by the County after Contractor provides the County with financial documentation sufficient for the County to determine whether Contractor has the financial resources to cover the requested deductible.

G. ADDITIONAL INSURANCE CONDITIONS:

Consultant's insurance shall apply as primary insurance with respect to any other insurance or self-insurance program maintained by the County. The County's insurance or self-insurance program shall be excess of Consultant's insurance and shall not contribute to it.

Any failure to comply with reporting provisions of the policies shall not affect coverage provided to Redwood County or its officers, officials, employees or volunteers.

Contractor must obtain insurance policies from insurance companies having an "AM BEST" rating of A:VII or better and authorized to do business in the State of Minnesota.

H. VERIFICATION OF COVERAGE:

Contractor shall provide the County with certificates of insurance and original endorsements showing that the Contractor has each type of insurance coverage and limits required under this Contract All certificates and endorsements are to be received and approved by the County before work commences.

A-5 PERFORMANCE BOND

The requirement of a performance bond in the total amount of the proposal will be waived and is NOT required.

A-6 INCREASED OR DECREASED QUANTITIES

Redwood County reserves the right to increase or decrease the estimated hours in whole or in part without adjustments in the contract unit prices and the provisions of 1903 shall not apply.

A-7 TERMINATION AND SUSPENSION

A. COUNTY TERMINATION AND SUSPENSION WITH CAUSE:

This Contract may be suspended or terminated by the County if the Contractor violates any of the terms or conditions of this Contract as determined by the County. In the event the County exercises its right to suspend or terminate this Contract, the County shall submit written notice to the Contractor specifying the extent of the suspension or termination and the reasons therefore, and the date upon which suspension or termination becomes effective.

B. COUNTY TERMINATION AND SUSPENSION WITHOUT CAUSE:

The County may terminate this Contract without cause by giving at least 30 days written notice to the Contractor. Upon receipt of a notice of such termination, the Contractor shall take all action necessary to discontinue work or further commit County funds.

C. CONTRACTOR TERMINATION WITH CAUSE:

This Contract may be terminated by the Contractor if the County violates any of the terms or conditions of this Contract as determined by the Contractor. In the event the Contractor exercises its right to terminate this Contract, the Contractor shall submit written notice to the County specifying the reasons therefore, and the date upon which termination becomes effective.

D. CONTRACTOR TERMINATION WITHOUT CAUSE:

The Contractor may terminate this Contract without cause by giving at least 30 days written notice to the County. Upon County's receipt of a notice of such termination, the Contractor shall cease all work on the Project and provide all documents pertaining to the Project to the County as soon as is reasonably feasible, but not longer than five (5) business dates from the County's receipt of the notice of termination.

E. PAYMENT UPON TERMINATION AND SUSPENSION WITH OR WITHOUT CAUSE:

The Contractor shall be entitled to payment for all work satisfactorily performed up to the day the termination or suspension takes effect, as determined by the County.

A-8 GENERAL PROVISIONS

A. ENTIRE CONTRACT; AMENDMENTS; CONFLICTS:

This Contract (including the exhibits attached hereto) constitutes the entire contract and understanding of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous contracts, documents and proposals, oral or written, between the parties with respect thereto. Any

amendment or modification to this Contract shall not be valid unless such amendment or modification (i) is in writing and signed by authorized representatives of both parties and (ii) references this Contract. The terms and conditions of the exhibits are integral parts of this Contract and are fully incorporated herein by this reference.

B. COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE LAW:

The Contractor agrees to comply with applicable federal, state and local laws or ordinances, and applicable rules, regulations, and standards established by any agency of such governmental units, which are now or hereafter promulgated insofar as they relate to the Contractor's performance of the provisions of this Contract. It shall be the obligation of the Contractor to maintain, pay for and obtain all licenses required by any governmental agency for the provision of those services contemplated herein.

C. GOVERNING LAW; JURISDICTION; VENUE:

This Contract shall be governed by the laws of the State of Minnesota, without regard to its conflict of laws rules. For the purpose of resolving conflicts related to or arising out of this Contract, the parties expressly agree that venue shall be exclusively in the State of Minnesota, County of Redwood. The parties hereby expressly consent to the exclusive personal jurisdiction of the federal and state courts located in the State of Minnesota, regardless of the citizenship or residency of either party at the time of the commencement of any legal proceeding.

D. DEBARMENT:

Contractor certifies that it is not prohibited from doing business with either the federal government or the State of Minnesota as a result of any debarment or suspension proceedings. Contractor's certification is a material representation upon which the County's approval of this Contract is based. Contractor shall provide immediate written notice to the County Engineer if at any time Contractor learns that this certification is erroneous or becomes erroneous due to changed circumstances.

E. CONFLICT OF INTEREST:

The Contractor affirms that, to the best of the Contractor's knowledge, the Contractor's involvement in this Contract does not result in a conflict of interest with any party or entity, which may be affected by the terms of this Contract. The Contractor agrees that, should any conflict or potential conflict of interest become known to the Contractor, it will immediately notify the County of the conflict or potential conflict, specifying the part of this Contract giving rise to the conflict or potential conflict, and will advise the County whether the Contractor will or will not resign from the other engagement or representation.

F. ASSIGNMENT AND DELEGATION:

Neither party shall assign its rights or delegate its duties under this Contract without receiving the prior written consent of the other party.

G. SUCCESSORS IN INTEREST:

The provisions of this Contract shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their permitted successors and assigns.

H. SEVERABILITY:

In the event that any portion of this Contract shall be held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Contract.

I. EXECUTION:

This Contract may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and to constitute one and the same instrument. Electronic copies of this Contract, including without limitation, those transmitted by facsimile or scanned to an image file, shall be considered originals.

J. AUDIT

Contractor shall maintain complete and accurate records with respect to costs incurred and services performed under this Agreement for a period of at least six (6) years after the termination of this Agreement. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 16C.05, Subd. 5, Contractor shall allow the County or other persons or agencies authorized by the County, including the Legislative or State Auditor, access to the records of Contractor at reasonable hours, including all books, records, documents, and accounting procedures and practices of Contractor relevant to the subject matter of the Contract, for purposes of audit.

K. NOTICE

Any notices required or permitted to be given under this Contract: (i) shall be in writing signed by or on behalf of the party making the same; (ii) shall be deemed given or delivered (a) if delivered personally, when received, (b) if sent from within the United States by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, on the third business day after mailing, or (c) if sent by messenger or reputable overnight courier service, on the next business day after mailing; and (iii) shall be addressed to each party at its address set forth in this Contract, or at such other address as the parties shall designate in writing by personal delivery, certified mail, or overnight courier service.

L. DISPUTES

The County Engineer will be the initial interpreter of the requirements of this Contract and will determine the acceptability of the work to be provided hereunder. All claims, disputes and other matters relating to the acceptability of the work must be referred to the County Engineer in writing with a request that a formal decision be made within a reasonable period of time. Written notice of

each claim, dispute or other matter must be delivered to the County Engineer within 30 days of the occurrence of the event giving rise to the claim, dispute or other matter. All data supporting the claim, dispute or other matter must be submitted to the County Engineer within 45 days of the event, unless the County Engineer allows for additional time based on the availability of complete and accurate data. The Contractor shall continue to perform while the claim or dispute is pending. The issuance of a decision by the County's Engineer shall be a condition precedent to the Contractor's exercise of the rights and remedies the Contractor may have under this Contract or at law with respect to the claim, dispute or other matter.

A-9 SURVIVAL

The provisions of this Contract which, by their terms, impose obligations that are continuing in nature and which must survive in order to give effect to their meaning will survive the expiration or termination of this Contract, including, without limitation, the following clauses:

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

DIVISION S SPECIAL PROVISIONS

- S-1 Payment for the use of each unit at the price per hour shall be compensation in full for the use and operation of such equipment, including fuel, grease, repairs, and other accessories required in connection with such use, and also including a competent operator.
- S-2 Payment for the equipment will be measured by the time in hours of actual working time.
- S-3 All roads that will have snow blown or pushed shall be at the discretion of the County Highway Engineer and County Highway Superintendent. All work will be done as scheduled, ordered and directed by the County Highway Engineer and County Highway Superintendent. The Contractor acknowledges that the time within which services must be rendered is of primary importance to the County and is of the essence to this Contract. All work shall be submitted on an invoice containing the required information for the Highway Department cost accounting system (including road number, task performed, number of hours) and payment shall be made monthly based on County Highway Dept. records.
- S-4 All equipment shall be equipped with all necessary highway safety lights and equipment meeting existing Minnesota standards and also with all necessary safety equipment meeting OSHA standards.
- S-5 This contract will cover the time period from date of award until a new contract is executed during the following year. If a new contract is not executed, the terms of this contract will expire upon 30 days notice to the bidder by the County Highway Engineer, or upon 30 days notice of the bidder to the County Highway Engineer.
- S-7 Standard of Care and Liability for Work: In performing the work under this Contract, the Contractor will use that degree of care, knowledge and skill ordinarily exercised by other reputable professionals in the field under like circumstances within the State of Minnesota.

The agency is made up of three key departments: Business Services, Social Services, and Public Health. Each of these departments play an important role in providing effective health and human services.

The Governing Board consists of two appointed County Commissioners from each of the member counties and by Minnesota statute, has responsibility for the development of an affordable system of care for all residents, especially, uninsured or underinsured children, families, and adults. The Human Services Governing Board has one layperson from each county who serves on the board.



Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion

As indicated by the strategic plan, SWHHS began activities addressing Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) to move the agency forward in becoming more welcoming and




diverse for clients and staff. Staff participate in monthly opportunities to increase knowledge and do best practice around topics such as ableism, structural racism, bias in communities, health equity, sexual orientation, and more. Ten agency staff participated in a DEI Activator series.

Public Health


COVID-19 Immunizations

Starting December 30, 2020, public health began giving COVID-19 immunizations to tier one ambulance and first responder staff. In total public health would give 7,615 immunizations. The immunizations that public health provided where done to increase capacity in the community. SWHHS provides limited immunizations to under-served populations regularly and atypically in mass scale as was needed with COVID-19.



Family Home Visiting

A grant for family home visiting, called Strong Foundations, was awarded to Public Health. This grant will support staff in the evidence-based practice, called Maternal Early Childhood Sustained Home-visiting (MECSH), and allows 22 additional families to be enrolled. Family home visiting programs based in evidence-based practice provides significant return on investment to communities through improved maternal newborn health, reduction in child injuries, abuse, neglect and/or maltreatment,



improvements in school readiness and parent-child relationships, reduction of domestic violence, and economic self-sufficiency of families. (5)

Social Services

Social Services Intake

Cases in social services were up slightly in 2021. As COVID-19 restrictions were lifted, most programs experienced the waiver ramp down and the return to meeting face-to-face for assessments and provide ongoing care coordination. Telehealth options continued in some instances but best practice indicates in person whenever possible.

Adult and Child Protection Intake

Mandated services, including adult and child protection, saw an increase in the number of assessments from the previous year. This was likely due to providers and family members not seeing consumers face-to-face and therefore not reporting concerns about vulnerable adults. There were 246 children placed in foster care in 2021, with most of those in traditional foster homes. SWHHS does have a high rate of relative foster care.



Opiate Allocation for Out-of-home Placement

The Department of Human Services (DHS) began providing an opiate allocation based on number of children in out of home placement related to parental chemical use.

A Circle of Hope began in the southern counties to support recovery. This was done through a partnership with Western Mental Health Center (WMHC). Families were assisted with housing, transportation and other basic needs.

Adult Services

MnCHOICES

MnCHOICES introduced a new assessment and support plan, which prompted onboarding requirements and training for assessors. Because of the state and federal health emergency orders due to COVID-19, those assessments typically completed in person were primarily done by phone and zoom meetings in 2021. While there were challenges of not being in person to do home assessments, this kept staff and clients safer while still providing and getting needed services. It also meant less travel time and decreased mileage costs.

Long Term Supports and Services

SWHHS staff were made aware of two nursing home closures in 2021. Divine Providence Nursing Home in Ivanhoe closed May 30, 2021 and Minneota Manor Nursing Home closed December 31, 2021. Both of these closed due to staffing shortages and less than adequate funding streams. SWHHS staff worked closely with these facilities to ensure a smooth transition for the residents. Unfortunately, many residents were moved to nursing homes out of the



area, as our local community nursing homes did not have the capacity to take these additional residents.

Children's and Family Services

Circle Program

Grant funding was renewed for the circle program, which resumed in 2021. Volunteer trainings took place as well as a school counselor training session at Southwest Minnesota State University (SMSU).

Children's Mental Health



The placement process had significant changes in 2021 to better support children who need the services of a treatment facility. The Family First Prevention Services Act requires every child to have a Juvenile Treatment Screening Team (JTST) assessment completed prior to admission. This helps determine if the needs can effectively be addressed in the community or if a Qualified Residential Treatment Program (QRTP) is an option. If indicated, a referral to DHS is made and a Qualified Individual (QI) assessor reviews the needs of the child,

providing a recommendation for the level of care for the child. If a child is admitted to a QRTP

Conditions for Permit No. 1-23 (Upland Hutterian Brethren Inc.)

- 1. The permit holder shall comply with all applicable laws, rules, and regulations, including but not limited to Redwood County Ordinance, as hereafter amended from time to time.
- 2. The permit holder shall dispose of the waste and refuse in a proper manner and in accord with all applicable laws, rules, and regulations.
- 3. The permit holder shall contact all relevant local, state, and federal authorities/entities and inquire as to whether a permit and/or license is required. If a permit and/or license is required, the permit holder shall apply for and obtain any and all required permits and/or licenses. A copy of all such permits and/or licenses shall be provided to the Redwood County Environmental Office upon request.
- 4. The permit holder shall take appropriate and reasonable measures to assure that all surface water runoff satisfies all applicable local, state, and federal discharge standards.
- 5. The permit holder shall not allow the conditional use to be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.
- 6. Adequate utilities, access roads, drainage, and other necessary facilities will be provided and continue to be provided by the permit holder now and in the future.
- 7. Adequate measures will be taken to provide sufficient off-street parking and loading space to serve the proposed conditional use. Parking shall comply with and is subject to all relevant local, state, and federal law, rules, and regulations. Parking and/or loading on the public road or within the road right-of-way is prohibited.
- 8. Up to twenty-four (24) single-family dwelling units may be constructed on the project site, pursuant to this permit. Any additional dwelling units beyond that will require a new Conditional Use Permit. The houses will be constructed substantially according to the site plan attached to the permit application, in the location indicated on the map attached to the permit and labeled "project site".
- Appropriate sewage treatment infrastructure will be installed and maintained, pursuant to Minnesota rules and laws, and Redwood County Code of Ordinances.
- 10. The private driveway leading to the houses constructed pursuant to this permit, shall be named and indicated on the official County E-911 Map, for emergency service purposes, pursuant to the Redwood County Enhanced E-911 regulations.
- 11. A 100 foot setback must be maintained between the county drain tile line on the site, and any building or structure.
- 12. The Redwood County Planning Commission shall review the conditional use permit and shall be authorized to take any and all necessary action(s), including but not






Proposed Upland Site

Conditions for Permit No. 1-23 (Upland Hutterian Brethren Inc.)

- 1. The permit holder shall comply with all applicable laws, rules, and regulations, including but not limited to Redwood County Ordinance, as hereafter amended from time to time.
- 2. The permit holder shall dispose of the waste and refuse in a proper manner and in accord with all applicable laws, rules, and regulations.
- 3. The permit holder shall contact all relevant local, state, and federal authorities/entities and inquire as to whether a permit and/or license is required. If a permit and/or license is required, the permit holder shall apply for and obtain any and all required permits and/or licenses. A copy of all such permits and/or licenses shall be provided to the Redwood County Environmental Office upon request.
- 4. The permit holder shall take appropriate and reasonable measures to assure that all surface water runoff satisfies all applicable local, state, and federal discharge standards.
- 5. The permit holder shall not allow the conditional use to be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.
- 6. Adequate utilities, access roads, drainage, and other necessary facilities will be provided and continue to be provided by the permit holder now and in the future.
- 7. Adequate measures will be taken to provide sufficient off-street parking and loading space to serve the proposed conditional use. Parking shall comply with and is subject to all relevant local, state, and federal law, rules, and regulations. Parking and/or loading on the public road or within the road right-of-way is prohibited.
- 8. Up to eight (8) additional dwelling houses may be constructed on the project site, pursuant to this permit. Any additional houses beyond that will require a new Conditional Use Permit. The houses will be constructed substantially according to the site plan attached to the permit application.
- 9. Appropriate sewage treatment infrastructure will be installed and maintained, pursuant to Minnesota rules and laws, and Redwood County Code of Ordinances.
- 10. The private driveway leading to the houses constructed pursuant to this permit, shall be named and indicated on the official County E-911 Map, for emergency service purposes, pursuant to the Redwood County Enhanced E-911 regulations.
- 11. A 100 foot setback must be maintained between the county drain tile line on the site, and any building or structure.
- 12. The Redwood County Planning Commission shall review the conditional use permit and shall be authorized to take any and all necessary action(s), including but not limited to revoking the conditional use permit and/or requiring the permit holder to

reapply for a conditional use permit, if: 1) The Redwood County Environmental Office acquires information previously unavailable that indicates the terms and conditions of the permit do not accurately represent the actual circumstances of the permitted facility or the conditional use; 2) It is discovered subsequent to the issuance of the permit the permit holder failed to disclose all facts relevant to the issuance of the permit or submitted false or misleading information to the Redwood County Environmental Office, the Redwood County Planning Commission, or the Redwood County Board of Commissioners; 3) The Redwood County Environmental Office determines the permitted facility or conditional use endangers human health or the environment; and/or (4) The permit holder violates any of the herein described conditions.

The Redwood County Board of Commissioners, sitting as the drainage authority for County Ditch 44, pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 103E.351, having adopted findings and ordered a redetermination of benefits on 02/01/2022; having appointed three viewers to redetermine and report the benefits and damages; having received the viewers' report; having followed proper notice requirements in Minn. Stat. § 103E.351; and having held a public hearing and followed all requirements of chapter 103E, based on the record and proceedings, Commissioner ______ moved, seconded by Commissioner _____ to adopt the following Findings and Order:

Findings:

- 1. Redwood County Board of Commissioners is the drainage authority for County Ditch 44.
- 2. On 02/01/2022, the drainage authority adopted findings and ordered the initiation of a redetermination of benefits and damages for County Ditch 44 pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 103E.351. Jim Weidemann, Steve Johnson, and Todd Hammer as viewers
- 3. County Environmental Director Scott Wold administered the Viewers' Oath on 03/16/2022
- 4. The viewers completed their report, which included a benefits and damages statement, on 12/01/2022, for all property affected by the drainage system and filed their report with the drainage authority.

- 5. The Environmental Director under direction from the drainage authority Board, prepared property owners' reports and mailed them to the owners of property identified in the viewers' report.
- 6. The drainage authority, by order, set a public hearing for review of the viewers' report on 12/13/2022, which is within 30 days after the property owners' reports were mailed.
- 7. A printed copy of the final hearing notice was posted for at least three weeks before the date of the final hearing at the front door of the Government Center of Redwood County.
- 8. Notice of the final hearing was published in the Redwood Gazette, for three successive weeks prior to the hearing.
- 9. Within one week after the first publication of the notice, the Redwood County Environmental Director provided notice by mail of the time and location of the final hearing to the commissioner of natural resources, all property owners, and others affected by the redetermination of benefits and listed in the viewers' report.
- 10. Proper notice of the redetermination hearing was made in conjunction with Minn. Stat. § 103E.351 requirements and chapters 103E. A record of the notice requirements is on file with the drainage authority.
- 11. Evidence of all actions in this matter, including findings and orders, appointments, oaths, affidavits of mailing, publication, and posting as well as hearing agendas, presentation materials, and recordings are present in the record of proceedings and are incorporated by reference.
- 12. The drainage authority held a public hearing on the redetermination of benefits on 01/17/2023 at 10:00 a.m. at Redwood County Government Center.
- 13. At the public hearing, Jim Weidemann, one of the duly appointed viewers, presented the viewers' report and explained the process of completing the viewers' report. Weidemann further provided detail of the viewing process and the information used by the viewers to: (1) verify the boundary of the watershed of the drainage system; (2) verify and confirm the existence of drainage benefit; and (3) determine the economic benefit to lands deriving a drainage benefit from the construction of County Ditch 44.
- 14. The viewers reviewed all property within the drainage areas of the drainage system as part of the redetermination of benefits process. The viewers determined the amount of damages to be paid for the acquisition of property for the establishment of best management practices, including grass strips, necessary to control erosion, sedimentation, improve water quality, or maintain the efficiency of the drainage

- system as required under Minn. Stat. § 103E.021. The viewers compared sales in the area in arriving at an average sales price used in establishing a payment rate.
- 15. The viewers used maps, LiDAR data, and other information, along with visual inspection of the watershed of the drainage system, to determine the boundaries of the benefiting area.
- 16. Within the watershed of the drainage system, the viewers paid particular attention to altered land use and drainage alterations which facilitate the removal of water from property directing it to the drainage system.
- 17. To determine the economic benefit to lands deriving a drainage benefit from the drainage system, the viewers conducted a condition comparison comparing the expected, pre-ditch, unaltered state of the watershed to the existing, altered and improved condition of the watershed. The viewers used this comparison in determining the increased market value of the properties receiving a direct drainage benefit.
- 18. Based on their detailed observations, the viewers determined benefit classifications, classified acres, and assigned economic benefit on a per acre basis.
- 19. The viewers determined that some acres within the watershed of the drainage system, i.e. existing wetlands and non-contributing basins, received a change in benefits from the drainage system.
- 20. The viewers accounted for the efficiency of the drainage system, as designed, and the proximity of lands to and the elevations of lands above the ditch.
- 21. The viewers applied an economic analysis using sales and income approaches to determine the increased value to each classification acre based on the drainage benefit provided by the drainage system.
- 22. The viewers determined the amount of economic benefit to property benefited immediately by the drainage system, or for property for which the drainage system can become an outlet for drainage, make an outlet more accessible, or otherwise directly benefit the property.
- 23. The viewers determined economic benefits based on: (1) an increase in the current market value of the property as a result of constructing the project; (2) an increase in the potential for agricultural production as a result of constructing the project; or (3) an increased value of the property as a result of potential different land use.

- 24. Within the watershed of the drainage system, the viewers determined benefits on property that are responsible for increased drainage system maintenance, or increased drainage system capacity because the natural drainage on the property has been altered or modified to accelerate the drainage of water from the property.
- 25. The viewers kept an accurate account of all time engaged in viewing and examination; the nature and kind of work performed; the days each viewer was engaged in said work; the amount charged per day by each viewer; and every item of expense incurred by the viewers in said work.
- 26. The viewers' account of work has been filed with the drainage authority.
- 27. Upon review of information provided to the Board during the public hearing, the Board further finds and confirms its earlier findings that the benefits and damages determined in the original proceedings, as well as the benefited and damaged areas determined in the original proceedings, do not reflect current, existing, actual benefits and benefitted areas.
- 28. The viewers' report is attached as **Exhibit A**.
- 29. The benefits and damages statement is attached as **Exhibit B**.
- 30. During the public hearing portion of the proceedings, the following persons appeared and provided comment.

- 31. At the close of the public comment hearing, Commissioner Groebner moved to accept the Redetermination of Benefits Report. Commissioner Forkrud seconded, and the motion carried.
- 32. At the close of the public comment hearing, Commissioner Wakefield moved to Set the payment terms as paid in full within 60 days, placed on taxes for 3 years at 4% interest, with all financed bills under \$100.00 to be paid in the first year. Commissioner Groebner seconded and the motion carried.
- 33. At the close of the public comment hearing, Commissioner Salfer moved to direct staff to prepare Findings and an Order consistent with the proceedings. Commissioner Groebner seconded, and the motion carried.

- 34. Based on the proceedings herein, the evidence presented during the pendency of these proceedings, the testimony of the viewers, and the public comments received, the Board finds:
 - a. that the viewers' report has been made and other proceedings have been completed under Minnesota Statutes, chapter 103E;
 - b. that the viewers' report is complete and correct;
 - c. that no evidence was presented in opposition to the benefits and damages determined by the viewers in the viewers' report;
 - d. that the redetermined benefits and damages, as reflected in the viewers' report as **Exhibit A**, and as described in the benefits and damages statement as **Exhibit B**, are proper, reasonable, and conform to the drainage code; and

Based on the foregoing Findings and the entire record of proceedings before the Board, the Board, acting as the drainage authority for Redwood County Ditch 44, hereby orders as follows:

- A. The redetermined benefits of Redwood County Ditch 44, the viewers' report attached hereto as **Exhibit A**, and the benefits and damages statement attached hereto as **Exhibit B** are hereby adopted by the Board and shall be used in place of the original benefits and damages in all subsequent proceedings.
- B. The viewers are allowed payment of their account of work.
- C. The County Auditor shall ensure that the redetermined benefits replace the existing benefits previously determined for Redwood County Ditch 44.

In accordance with the Minnesota Statute 103E.351, we herewith submit the following viewers' report:

Benefits and Damages Statement

This report covers the redetermination of benefits for a previously constructed drainage system. The method for determining benefits and damages is based upon a comparison of the conditions that would have existed prior to the ditch system's construction with those that do exist with the drainage system in a reasonable state of repair.

County Ditch No 44 was petitioned for in 1917. The original viewers' report had \$4,780.00 net benefits and the cost was \$2,678.50. There were 69.65 acres benefited. In 1985, there was a solid pipe replacing some tile because of tree roots. In 2010, a water main repair was done by the county tile system. It drains parts of Sections 1 and 12 of Redwood Falls Towship (T112N-R26W). The flow is northerly and empties into CD No. 52 in Section 1 in the city of Redwood Falls.

The field observations for the watershed and land classifications were done in June of 2022. We made an on-site inspection of each 40 acre or smaller parcel. There are 75 acres plus 103 city acres for a total of 178 acres benefited within this watershed.

Supporting documentation for the analysis and conclusions of the report are contained in our files and are available for inspection.

The figures stated herein are based on a full and fair consideration of all pertinent facts and information that we were aware of at the time of this appraisal. The following aids were used during the viewing process.

Soil survey manual and maps of Redwood County

- FSA aerial photos
- Topographical and LiDAR maps
- Yield averages and production costs taken from the Farm Business Management Reports
- Visual inspection of each 40 acre parcel
- · Original maps and profiles
- Sales data from the Redwood County Assessor's Office

Land classification benefit values are based upon an increase in the potential for agricultural production as a result of constructing the drainage project and reconciled with sales value increases. Existing individual land management practices were not considered. All present land use was evaluated under estimated best land management practice. Consideration was given to areas which were determined to be in a native/non-converted condition, government lands, and permanent set-aside acres (RIM, CREP)

Valuation Prior To Drainage

Beginning land use, property value, and economic productivity have been determined with the consideration that the benefited properties within the watershed originally did not have an adequate outlet for artificial drainage.

- "A" Standing water or cattails, wetland classification with a market value for agricultural purposes of \$0.00 per acre, economic productivity of \$0.00.
- "B" Seasonally flooded/pasture ground. Pasture classification with a market value of \$2400 to \$2800 per acre, economic productivity of \$90 based on grazing days and/or hay values.
- "C" Wet subsoil- Marginal crop land, low to medium crop land classification with a market value of \$6400 to \$6800 per acre, annual economic productivity of \$664.00 based upon average annual yield of 80% of optimum with \$378.00 production costs.
- D" Upland areas not needing artificial drainage, but irregular in shape and intermixed with wetter soils. Medium to high cropland classification with a market value of \$8000 to \$8400 per acre, annual economic productivity of \$796.80 based upon average annual yield of 96% of optimum with \$378.00 production costs.

Valuation with NRCS Recommended Drainage

Potential land use, property value, and economic productivity, after public and private drainage have been installed as per NRCS design standards as recommended in the Minnesota Drainage Guide, using current crop rotation, income, and expense:

- "A" Drained slough area, medium classification land with a market value of \$7000 to \$7400 per acre, economic productivity of \$747.00 based upon average production of 90% of optimum with \$378.00 production costs.
- "B" Well drained ground, high land classification with a market value of \$8200 to \$8600 per acre, economic productivity of \$788.50 based upon average annual production 95% of optimum with \$378.00 production costs.
- "C" Well drained ground, highest land classification with an estimated market value of \$9300 to \$9700 per acre, economic productivity of \$821.70 based upon average annual production of 99% of optimum with \$378.00 production costs.
- "D" Well drained ground, high land classification with improved farmability and market value of \$8800 to \$9200 per acre, economic productivity of \$830.00 based upon average production of 100% of optimum with \$378.00 production costs.

A "D-" classification was assigned to the building site acres.

Utilizing these productive values, potential benefits values were determined for the system based upon a 25 year effective life with proper maintenance, private improvement cost depreciated over the same 25 year period, and an allowance of 3% return on the system investment.

The drainage system as originally constructed does not meet the NRCS recommended drainage capacities for agricultural drainage. Considering the impacts of the restrictive capacity, an efficiency rate has been applied. This rate reflects the viewers' determination of that portion of the potential benefit currently being provided the County Ditch System. Proximity adjustments were made to allow for construction of the public or private laterals required to improve the drainage capacity to meet the NRCS recommendation.

The viewers' report of acres benefited show the amount of each type of soil classification ('A'; 'B'; 'C'; 'D'; 'D-') and the value for each type based on potential increased agricultural production. The proximity factor was applied to arrive at the net benefits.

Road benefits were determined with consideration of the reduced construction and maintenance costs that were realized after construction of the drainage system.

Tile benefits were given to reflect the additional value added as the ditch system tile provides one of the normal lines of tiles for subsurface drainage.

The Redwood County Board of Commissioners, sitting as the drainage authority for County Ditch 48, pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 103E.351, having adopted findings and ordered a redetermination of benefits on 02/01/2022; having appointed three viewers to redetermine and report the benefits and damages; having received the viewers' report; having followed proper notice requirements in Minn. Stat. § 103E.351; and having held a public hearing and followed all requirements of chapter 103E, based on the record and proceedings, Commissioner ______ moved, seconded by Commissioner ______ to adopt the following Findings and Order:

Findings:

- 1. Redwood County Board of Commissioners is the drainage authority for County Ditch 48.
- 2. On 02/01/2022, the drainage authority adopted findings and ordered the initiation of a redetermination of benefits and damages for County Ditch 48 pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 103E.351. Jim Weidemann, Steve Johnson, and Todd Hammer as viewers
- 3. County Environmental Director Scott Wold administered the Viewers' Oath on 03/16/2022
- 4. The viewers completed their report, which included a benefits and damages statement, on 12/01/2022, for all property affected by the drainage system and filed their report with the drainage authority.

- 5. The Environmental Director under direction from the drainage authority Board, prepared property owners' reports and mailed them to the owners of property identified in the viewers' report.
- 6. The drainage authority, by order, set a public hearing for review of the viewers' report on 12/13/2022, which is within 30 days after the property owners' reports were mailed.
- 7. A printed copy of the final hearing notice was posted for at least three weeks before the date of the final hearing at the front door of the Government Center of Redwood County.
- 8. Notice of the final hearing was published in the Redwood Gazette, for three successive weeks prior to the hearing.
- 9. Within one week after the first publication of the notice, the Redwood County Environmental Director provided notice by mail of the time and location of the final hearing to the commissioner of natural resources, all property owners, and others affected by the redetermination of benefits and listed in the viewers' report.
- 10. Proper notice of the redetermination hearing was made in conjunction with Minn. Stat. § 103E.351 requirements and chapters 103E. A record of the notice requirements is on file with the drainage authority.
- 11. Evidence of all actions in this matter, including findings and orders, appointments, oaths, affidavits of mailing, publication, and posting as well as hearing agendas, presentation materials, and recordings are present in the record of proceedings and are incorporated by reference.
- 12. The drainage authority held a public hearing on the redetermination of benefits on 01/17/2023 at 10:00 a.m. at Redwood County Government Center.
- 13. At the public hearing, Jim Weidemann, one of the duly appointed viewers, presented the viewers' report and explained the process of completing the viewers' report. Weidemann further provided detail of the viewing process and the information used by the viewers to: (1) verify the boundary of the watershed of the drainage system; (2) verify and confirm the existence of drainage benefit; and (3) determine the economic benefit to lands deriving a drainage benefit from the construction of County Ditch 48.
- 14. The viewers reviewed all property within the drainage areas of the drainage system as part of the redetermination of benefits process. The viewers determined the amount of damages to be paid for the acquisition of property for the establishment of best management practices, including grass strips, necessary to control erosion, sedimentation, improve water quality, or maintain the efficiency of the drainage

- system as required under Minn. Stat. § 103E.021. The viewers compared sales in the area in arriving at an average sales price used in establishing a payment rate.
- 15. The viewers used maps, LiDAR data, and other information, along with visual inspection of the watershed of the drainage system, to determine the boundaries of the benefiting area.
- 16. Within the watershed of the drainage system, the viewers paid particular attention to altered land use and drainage alterations which facilitate the removal of water from property directing it to the drainage system.
- 17. To determine the economic benefit to lands deriving a drainage benefit from the drainage system, the viewers conducted a condition comparison comparing the expected, pre-ditch, unaltered state of the watershed to the existing, altered and improved condition of the watershed. The viewers used this comparison in determining the increased market value of the properties receiving a direct drainage benefit.
- 18. Based on their detailed observations, the viewers determined benefit classifications, classified acres, and assigned economic benefit on a per acre basis.
- 19. The viewers determined that some acres within the watershed of the drainage system, i.e. existing wetlands and non-contributing basins, received a change in benefits from the drainage system.
- 20. The viewers accounted for the efficiency of the drainage system, as designed, and the proximity of lands to and the elevations of lands above the ditch.
- 21. The viewers applied an economic analysis using sales and income approaches to determine the increased value to each classification acre based on the drainage benefit provided by the drainage system.
- 22. The viewers determined the amount of economic benefit to property benefited immediately by the drainage system, or for property for which the drainage system can become an outlet for drainage, make an outlet more accessible, or otherwise directly benefit the property.
- 23. The viewers determined economic benefits based on: (1) an increase in the current market value of the property as a result of constructing the project; (2) an increase in the potential for agricultural production as a result of constructing the project; or (3) an increased value of the property as a result of potential different land use.

- 24. Within the watershed of the drainage system, the viewers determined benefits on property that are responsible for increased drainage system maintenance, or increased drainage system capacity because the natural drainage on the property has been altered or modified to accelerate the drainage of water from the property.
- 25. The viewers kept an accurate account of all time engaged in viewing and examination; the nature and kind of work performed; the days each viewer was engaged in said work; the amount charged per day by each viewer; and every item of expense incurred by the viewers in said work.
- 26. The viewers' account of work has been filed with the drainage authority.
- 27. Upon review of information provided to the Board during the public hearing, the Board further finds and confirms its earlier findings that the benefits and damages determined in the original proceedings, as well as the benefited and damaged areas determined in the original proceedings, do not reflect current, existing, actual benefits and benefitted areas.
- 28. The viewers' report is attached as **Exhibit A**.
- 29. The benefits and damages statement is attached as **Exhibit B**.
- 30. During the public hearing portion of the proceedings, the following persons appeared and provided comment.

- 31. At the close of the public comment hearing, Commissioner Groebner moved to accept the Redetermination of Benefits Report. Commissioner Forkrud seconded, and the motion carried.
- 32. At the close of the public comment hearing, Commissioner Wakefield moved to Set the payment terms as paid in full within 60 days, placed on taxes for 3 years at 4% interest, with all financed bills under \$100.00 to be paid in the first year. Commissioner Groebner seconded and the motion carried.
- 33. At the close of the public comment hearing, Commissioner Salfer moved to direct staff to prepare Findings and an Order consistent with the proceedings. Commissioner Groebner seconded, and the motion carried.

- 34. Based on the proceedings herein, the evidence presented during the pendency of these proceedings, the testimony of the viewers, and the public comments received, the Board finds:
 - a. that the viewers' report has been made and other proceedings have been completed under Minnesota Statutes, chapter 103E;
 - b. that the viewers' report is complete and correct;
 - c. that no evidence was presented in opposition to the benefits and damages determined by the viewers in the viewers' report;
 - d. that the redetermined benefits and damages, as reflected in the viewers' report as **Exhibit A**, and as described in the benefits and damages statement as **Exhibit B**, are proper, reasonable, and conform to the drainage code; and

Based on the foregoing Findings and the entire record of proceedings before the Board, the Board, acting as the drainage authority for Redwood County Ditch 48, hereby orders as follows:

- A. The redetermined benefits of Redwood County Ditch 48, the viewers' report attached hereto as **Exhibit A**, and the benefits and damages statement attached hereto as **Exhibit B** are hereby adopted by the Board and shall be used in place of the original benefits and damages in all subsequent proceedings.

Benefits and damages statement

This report covers the redetermination for a previously constructed drainage system. The basis for determining benefits and damages is therefore, based upon a comparison of the conditions that would have existed prior to the County tile systems construction, with those that do exist with the drainage system in a reasonable state of repair. Supporting documentation for the analysis and conclusions of the report are contained in our files and are available for inspection. The figures stated herein are based on a full and fair comparison of all pertinent facts and information that we were aware of at the time of this redetermination process. The following aids were used in this viewing process.

- Redwood County online GIS parcel information site
- USDA web soil survey
- Google Earth aerial satellite photos
- Yield averages taken from USDA national agriculture statistics service
- Production costs taken from University of Minnesota FinBin
- Average commodity sale prices taken from University of Minnesota FinBin
- Sales data from the Redwood County Assessor office and website
- Visual inspection of each 40 acre parcel or less
- Consultation with the Redwood County Environmental Office and Drainage Staff

The Viewers determined that the lands affected by the drainage system are generally similar and that the following comments refer to all such tracts.

1. Existing land use, property value and economic productivity:

Land is presently used for building sites, roads and for agricultural purposes. The property value is consistent with most agricultural land sales within Redwood County. Agricultural lands are primarily used for the production of corn and soybeans. The land has good economic productivity when properly drained.

2. Potential land use, property value and economic productivity from the drainage system:

The drainage system has been in existence for many years and provides drainage for agricultural purposes. The property value is consistent with most agricultural land sales within Redwood County. Land affected by the drainage system has the potential to produce above average yields.

3. The benefits or damages from the drainage system:

Benefits derived by lands affected by the drainage system are due to (A) Improved capacity to remove surface waters due to previous construction and maintenance of the County tile system, which results in an increase in the current market value of property; or (B) an increase in the potential for agricultural production as a result of the previous construction and continued maintenance of the drainage system; or (C) increased value of the property as a result of potential different land use.

- 4. There is no damage to any riparian rights.
- 5. There are no acres added to any tract or lot and there are no public waters, wetlands, and other areas not currently being cultivated, that are proposed to be drained in this proceeding.
- 6. There are no acres which before the drainage benefits could be realized would require a public waters work permit to work in public waters under 103G.245 to excavate or fill a navigable water body under United States Code, Title 33, Section 403, or a permit to discharge into waters of United States under United States Code, Title 33, Section 1344.

Valuation prior to drainage

Beginning land use, property value, and economic productivity have been determined with the consideration that the benefited properties within the watershed originally did not have an adequate outlet for artificial drainage.

- "A" Standing water or cattails, wetland classification with economic productivity for agriculture purposes of \$0 per acre, and a market value of \$1,000 to \$2,000
- "B" Seasonally flooded/pasture ground. Pasture classification with economic productivity of \$100 per acre based on grazing days and/or hay values, and a market value of \$2,500 to \$3.500.
- "C" Wet subsoil Generally farmable land with moderate crop potential, with annual economic productivity of \$499 per acre based upon average annual yield of 70% of optimum with \$329 production costs, and a market value of \$4,000 to \$5,000.
- "D" Upland areas not needing much artificial drainage and intermixed with wetter soils, with annual economic productivity of \$641 per acre based upon an average annual yield of 90% of optimum with \$329 production costs, and a market value of \$5,000 to \$6,000.

Valuation with NRCS recommended drainage

Potential land use, property value, and an increase in economic productivity, after public and private drainage have been installed as NRCS design standards as recommended in the Minnesota Drainage Guide, using current crop rotation, income, and expense.

- "A" Drained slough area, medium classification land with economic productivity of \$542 per acre based upon average production of 76% of optimum with \$329 per acre production costs, and a market value of \$5,000 to \$6,500.
- "B" Well drained ground, high land classification with economic productivity of \$570 per acre based upon average annual production of 80% of optimum with \$329 production costs, and a market value of \$5,500 to \$7,500.
- "C" Well drained ground, highest land classification with economic productivity of \$599 per acre based upon average annual production of 84% of optimum with \$329 production costs, and a market value of \$6,500 to \$9,000.
- "D" Well drained ground, high land classification with improved farm ability, with economic productivity of \$699 per acre based upon average production of 98% of optimum with \$329 production costs, and a market value of \$5,500 to \$7,500.

Utilizing these productive values, potential benefit values were determined for the system based upon a 25 year effective life with proper maintenance. Private tile improvement cost were depreciated over the same 25 year period, and an allowance of 0.5% return on the system investment. A three year average Township yield was used for the benefit value calculations along with a three year average sale price for the corn and beans.

RESOLUTION 2023-02

A RESOLUTION TO EXPEND CORONAVIRUS LOCAL FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS UNDER THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT FOR PLUM CREEK COUNTY PARK WATERFRONT IMPROVEMENTS

WHEREAS, Redwood County ("County") received Federal Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds under the American Rescue Plan Act ("ARP"), to provide relief to the county impacted by the coronavirus disease 2019 ("COVID-19");

WHEREAS, Redwood County Environmental Director, Scott Wold has identified a necessary expense to make improvements to the waterfront at Plum Creek County Park;

WHEREAS, the authority under the ARP Act allows this expenditure, per the Final Rule published on January 6, 2022, 31 C.F.R § 35

§35.6(d) Providing government services. A recipient may use funds for the provision of government services to the extent of the reduction in the recipient's general revenue due to the public health emergency, calculated according to this paragraph (d). A recipient must make a one-time election to calculate the amount of the reduction in the recipient's general revenue due to the public health emergency according to either paragraph (d)(1) or (d)(2) of this section:

§35.6(d)(1) Standard allowance. The reduction in the recipient's general revenue due to the public health emergency over the period of performance will be deemed to be ten million dollars; or

WHEREAS, The Redwood County Board of Commissioners voted to authorize Redwood County to expend American Rescue Plan Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds utilizing the Standard (Revenue Loss) Allowance at their Regular Board Meeting held on March 1, 2022;

WHEREAS, A project proposal to improve the waterfront was prepared by a licensed landscape architect and has an estimated cost of \$909,488 of which \$818,539 was secured through a state grant from the Greater Minnesota Parks and Trails Commission (award letter attached) and the remaining \$90,949 is needed to complete the proposed project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the County Board of Commissioners is encumbering \$90,949.00 to be used to complete the improvements to the waterfront at Plum Creek County Park and certifies that the funds appropriated from the ARP Act fund will be used only in a manner consistent with the Department of the U.S. Treasury guidance and incurred during the covered period.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption on January 17, 2023.



ASSESSMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN LOCAL UNIT AND COUNTY OF REDWOOD

THIS AGREEMENT ("Agreement"), Made and entered into by and between the COUNTY OF REDWOOD, a political subdivision of the State of Minnesota, hereinafter referred to as the "COUNTY", and the Township of Paxton, a political subdivision of the State of Minnesota, hereinafter referred to as TOWNSHIP

WHEREAS, said TOWNSHIP lies wholly within the COUNTY OF REDWOOD and constitutes a separate assessment district;

WHEREAS, under such circumstances, the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 273.072 and Minnesota Statutes, Section 471.59 permit the County Assessor to provide for the assessment of property;

WHEREAS, said TOWNSHIP desires the COUNTY to perform certain assessments on behalf of said TOWNSHIP; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY maintains a County Assessor pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 273.061 and is willing and able to provide assessment services to TOWNSHIP;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, it is agreed as follows:

- 1. Scope of Services. The COUNTY shall perform the property assessment for the TOWNSHIP in accordance with property assessment procedures and practices established and observed by the COUNTY, the validity and reasonableness of which are hereby acknowledged and approved by the TOWNSHIP. Any such practices and procedures may be changed from time to time, by the COUNTY in its sole judgment, when good and efficient assessment procedures so require. The property assessment by the COUNTY shall be composed of those assessment services which are set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto and made a part hereof by this reference, provided that the time frames set forth therein shall be considered to be approximate only.
- 2. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement shall commence on December 1, 2022, and shall terminate on June 30, 2023. Either party may initiate an extension of this Agreement for a term of three years by giving the other written notice of its intent to so extend prior to ninety (90) days prior to the anniversary date of this agreement. Any extended term hereof shall be on the same terms and conditions set forth herein. If the party who receives said notice of intent to extend gives written notice to the other party of its desire not to extend prior to, ninety (90) days, this Agreement shall terminate on June 30,2023.
- 3. <u>Records and Information</u>. All information, records, data, reports, etc. necessary to allow the COUNTY to carry out its herein responsibilities shall be furnished to the COUNTY without charge by the TOWNSHIP, and the TOWNSHIP agrees to cooperate in good faith with the COUNTY in carrying out the work under this Agreement.

The COUNTY shall own and retain all records, including but not limited to any and all assessment appraisal records, created by the County Assessor under this Agreement and shall be the responsible party for said records under the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act (Minnesota Statutes Chapter 13). The COUNTY shall continue to own and retain, subject to statutory retention obligations, all such records after the termination of this Agreement.

4. <u>Duties of COUNTY</u>. The COUNTY will abide by the requirements of Minnesota Statute, section 273.061 for establishment of an office of county assessor. The COUNTY represents that is has, or will secure at its own expense, all personnel required to perform the assessment services under this agreement. All such personnel shall meet the applicable accreditation standards and other ethical guidelines that apply to individuals providing assessing services in the State of Minnesota.

The COUNTY shall provide all assessing duties and services to Township of Paxton and shall prepare and submit such reports as shall be necessary and required by Minnesota law. The County Assessor shall attend such meetings, hearings, board of review hearings or other such public meetings or hearings as shall reasonably by required by to fulfill the duties and obligations of the COUNTY under this Agreement.

5. <u>Authorized Representative</u>. The County Assessor shall serve as the Authorized Representative of the County and as the liaison with the TOWNSHIP. The Authorized Representative shall have the express authority to make all contacts with the Township of Paxton on behalf of the County. The TOWNSHIP shall submit reports and other materials prepared pursuant to this Agreement to the Authority's Authorized Representative, by mailing or delivering them to:

- 6. Relationship between the Parties. It is agreed that nothing herein contained is intended or should be construed in any manner as creating or establishing the relationship of joint ventures, co-partners, or an association between the parties hereto or as constituting the TOWNSHIP as the agent, representative or employee of the COUNTY for any purpose or in any manner whatsoever.
- 7. Indemnification. The TOWNSHIP agrees that it will defend, indemnify and hold the COUNTY, its elected officials, officers, agents, employees and duly authorized volunteers harmless from any and all liability (statutory or otherwise) claims, suits, damages, judgments, interest, costs or expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees, witness fees and disbursements incurred in the defense thereof) resulting from or caused by the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of the TOWNSHIP, its officers, agents, contractors, employees or duly authorized volunteers in the performance of the responsibilities provided by this Agreement. The TOWNSHIP's liability shall be governed by Minn. Stat. Chapter 466 and other applicable law, rule and regulation, including common law.

COUNTY agrees that it will defend, indemnify and hold the TOWNSHIP, its elected officials, officers, agents, employees and duly authorized volunteers harmless from any and all liability (statutory or otherwise) claims, suits, damages, judgments, interest, costs or expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees, witness fees and disbursements incurred in the defense thereof) resulting from or caused by the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of the COUNTY, its officers, agents, contractors, employees or duly authorized volunteers in the performance of the responsibilities provided by this Agreement. The COUNTY's liability shall be governed by Minn. Stat. Chapter 466 and other applicable law, rule and regulation, including common law.

- 8. <u>Compensation.</u> The current assessment contains approximately 626 Parcels. In consideration for said assessment services, the TOWNSHIP shall pay to COUNTY the sum of \$12.00 per parcel for 2023. Payment shall be made payable June 15, 2023. Payment would be made payable to the County of Redwood directed to the County Auditor/Treasurer.
- 9. Notice. Any notices required or permitted to be given under this Agreement: (i) shall be in writing signed by or on behalf of the party making the same; (ii) shall be deemed given or delivered (a) if delivered personally, when received, (b) if sent from within the United States by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, on the third business day after mailing, or (c) if sent by messenger or reputable overnight courier service, on the next business day after mailing; and (iii) shall be addressed to each party at its address set forth in this Agreement, or at such other address as the parties shall designate in writing by personal delivery, certified mail, or overnight courier service.
- 10. <u>Disputes.</u> The COUNTY's Authorized Representative will be the initial interpreter of the requirements of this Agreement and will determine the acceptability of the work to be provided hereunder. All claims, disputes and other matters relating to the acceptability of the work must be referred to the COUNTY's Authorized Representative in writing with a request that a formal decision be made within a reasonable period of time. Written notice of each claim, dispute or other matter must be delivered to the COUNTY's Authorized Representative within 30 days of the occurrence of the event giving rise to the claim, dispute or other matter. All data supporting the claim, dispute or other matter must be submitted to the COUNTY's Authorized Representative within 45 days of the event, unless the COUNTY's Authorized Representative allows for additional time based on the availability of complete and accurate data. The COUNTY shall continue to perform while the claim or dispute is pending. The issuance of a decision by the COUNTY's Authorized Representative shall be a condition precedent to the TOWNSHIP's exercise of the rights and remedies the TOWNSHIP may have under this Agreement or at law with respect to the claim, dispute or other matter.

11. Termination.

With Cause. This Agreement may be suspended or terminated by either party if any of the terms or conditions of this Agreement are violated. In the event either party exercises its right to terminate this Agreement, the terminating party shall submit written notice to the other party specifying the extent of the termination and the reasons therefore, and the date upon which termination becomes effective.

Without Cause. Either party may terminate this Agreement without cause by giving at least 90 days written notice to the other party. Upon receipt of a notice of such termination, the COUNTY shall take all action necessary to discontinue work pursuant to the Agreement.

<u>Payment upon Termination</u>. The COUNTY shall be entitled to payment for all work satisfactorily performed.

If the TOWNSHIP should cancel this Agreement, as above provided, before the completion of the then current property assessment by the COUNTY, the TOWNSHIP agrees to defend and hold the COUNTY, its officials, officers, agents, employees and duly authorized volunteers harmless from any liability that might ensue as a result of the non-completion of a property tax assessment.

- 12. <u>Survival</u>. The provisions of this Agreement which, by their terms, impose obligations that are continuing in nature and which must survive in order to give effect to their meaning will survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement, including, without limitation, the following clauses: Indemnification; Records and Information; Governing Law; Jurisdiction; Venue.
- 13. Entire Agreement; Amendments; Conflicts. This Agreement (including the exhibits attached hereto) constitutes the entire agreement and understanding of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous agreements, documents and proposals, oral or written, between the parties with respect thereto. Any amendment or modification to this Agreement shall not be valid unless such amendment or modification (i) is in writing and signed by authorized representatives of both parties and (ii) references this Agreement. The terms and conditions of the exhibits are integral parts of this Agreement and are fully incorporated herein by this reference.
- 14. Compliance with Applicable Law. The COUNTY agrees to comply with applicable federal, state and local laws or ordinances, and applicable rules, regulations, and standards established by any agency of such governmental units, which are now or hereafter promulgated insofar as they relate to the COUNTY's performance of the provisions of this Agreement. It shall be the obligation of the COUNTY to apply for, pay for and obtain all permits and/or licenses required by any governmental agency for the provision of those services contemplated herein.
- 15. Governing Law; Jurisdiction; Venue. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Minnesota, without regard to its conflict of laws rules. For the purpose of resolving conflicts related to or arising out of this Agreement, the parties expressly agree that venue shall be exclusively in the State of Minnesota, County of Redwood. The parties hereby expressly consent to the exclusive personal jurisdiction of the federal and state courts located in the State of Minnesota, regardless of the citizenship or residency of either party at the time of the commencement of any legal proceeding.
- 16. <u>Equal Employment Opportunity</u>. In connection with the execution of this Agreement, the COUNTY agrees that it will comply with Minn. State § 363A.08, to not discriminate

- against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, creed, religion, national original, sex, marital status, status with regard to public assistance, membership or activity in a local commission, disability, sexual orientation, or age.
- 17. Conflict of Interest. The parties affirms that, to the best of their knowledge, this Agreement does not result in a conflict of interest with any party or entity, which may be affected by the terms of this Agreement. The parties agrees that, should any conflict or potential conflict of interest become known to the parties, they will immediately notify the other party of the conflict or potential conflict, specifying the part of this Agreement giving rise to the conflict or potential conflict.
- 18. Severability. In the event that any portion of this Agreement shall be held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Agreement.
- 19. <u>Execution</u>. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and to constitute one and the same instrument. Electronic copies of this Agreement, including without limitation, those transmitted by facsimile or scanned to an image file, shall be considered originals.

ASSESSMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN LOCAL UNIT AND COUNTY OF REDWOOD

THIS AGREEMENT ("Agreement"), Made and entered into by and between the COUNTY OF REDWOOD, a political subdivision of the State of Minnesota, hereinafter referred to as the "COUNTY", and the City of Redwood Falls, a political subdivision of the State of Minnesota, hereinafter referred to as "CITY";

WHEREAS, said CITY lies wholly within the COUNTY OF REDWOOD and constitutes a separate assessment district;

WHEREAS, under such circumstances, the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 273.072 and Minnesota Statutes, Section 471.59 permit the County Assessor to provide for the assessment of property;

WHEREAS, said CITY desires the COUNTY to perform certain assessments on behalf of said CITY; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY maintains a County Assessor pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 273.061 and is willing and able to provide assessment services to CITY;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, it is agreed as follows:

- 1. Scope of Services. The COUNTY shall perform the property assessment for the CITY in accordance with property assessment procedures and practices established and observed by the COUNTY, the validity and reasonableness of which are hereby acknowledged and approved by the CITY. Any such practices and procedures may be changed from time to time, by the COUNTY in its sole judgment, when good and efficient assessment procedures so require. The property assessment by the COUNTY shall be composed of those assessment services which are set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto and made a part hereof by this reference, provided that the time frames set forth therein shall be considered to be approximate only.
- 2. Term. This Agreement shall commence on January 1, 2023, and shall terminate on December 31, 2025. Either party may initiate an extension of this Agreement for a term of three years by giving the other written notice of its intent to so extend prior to ninety (90) days prior to the anniversary date of this agreement. Any extended term hereof shall be on the same terms and conditions set forth herein. If the party who receives said notice of intent to extend gives written notice to the other party of its desire not to extend prior to, ninety (90) days, this Agreement shall terminate on December 31, 2025.
- 3. <u>Records and Information</u>. All information, records, data, reports, etc. necessary to allow the COUNTY to carry out its herein responsibilities shall be furnished to the COUNTY without charge by the CITY, and the CITY agrees to cooperate in good faith with the COUNTY in carrying out the work under this Agreement.

The COUNTY shall own and retain all records, including but not limited to any and all assessment appraisal records, created by the County Assessor under this Agreement and shall be the responsible party for said records under the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act (Minnesota Statutes Chapter 13). The COUNTY shall continue to own and retain, subject to statutory retention obligations, all such records after the termination of this Agreement.

4. <u>Duties of COUNTY</u>. The COUNTY will abide by the requirements of Minnesota Statute, section 273.061 for establishment of an office of county assessor. The COUNTY represents that is has, or will secure at its own expense, all personnel required to perform the assessment services under this agreement. All such personnel shall meet the applicable accreditation standards and other ethical guidelines that apply to individuals providing assessing services in the State of Minnesota.

The COUNTY shall provide all assessing duties and services to CITY and shall prepare and submit such reports as shall be necessary and required by Minnesota law. The County Assessor shall attend such meetings, hearings, board of review hearings or other such public meetings or hearings as shall reasonably be required to fulfill the duties and obligations of the COUNTY under this Agreement.

5. Authorized Representative. The County Assessor shall serve as the Authorized Representative of the County and as the liaison with the CITY. The Authorized Representative shall have the express authority to make all contacts with the CITY on behalf of the County. The CITY shall submit reports and other materials prepared pursuant to this Agreement to the Authority's Authorized Representative, by mailing or delivering them to:

- 6. Relationship between the Parties. It is agreed that nothing herein contained is intended or should be construed in any manner as creating or establishing the relationship of joint ventures, co-partners, or an association between the parties hereto or as constituting the CITY as the agent, representative or employee of the COUNTY for any purpose or in any manner whatsoever.
- 7. <u>Indemnification.</u> The CITY agrees that it will defend, indemnify and hold the COUNTY, its elected officials, officers, agents, employees and duly authorized volunteers harmless from any and all liability (statutory or otherwise) claims, suits, damages, judgments, interest, costs or expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees, witness fees and disbursements incurred in the defense thereof) resulting from or caused by the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of the CITY, its officers, agents, contractors, employees or duly authorized volunteers in the performance of the responsibilities provided by this Agreement. The CITY's liability shall be governed by Minn. Stat. Chapter 466 and other applicable law, rule and regulation, including common law.

COUNTY agrees that it will defend, indemnify and hold the CITY, its elected officials,

officers, agents, employees and duly authorized volunteers harmless from any and all liability (statutory or otherwise) claims, suits, damages, judgments, interest, costs or expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees, witness fees and disbursements incurred in the defense thereof) resulting from or caused by the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of the COUNTY, its officers, agents, contractors, employees or duly authorized volunteers in the performance of the responsibilities provided by this Agreement. The COUNTY's liability shall be governed by Minn. Stat. Chapter 466 and other applicable law, rule and regulation, including common law.

- 8. Compensation. The current assessment contains approximately 2,737 assessments. In consideration for said assessment services, the CITY shall pay to COUNTY the sum of \$50,700 for 2023, \$51,700 for 2024 and \$52,700 for 2025. Payment shall be made payable one-half on January 15 of each year and the other half June 15. Payment would be made payable to the County of Redwood directed to the County Auditor/Treasurer.
- 9. Notice. Any notices required or permitted to be given under this Agreement: (i) shall be in writing signed by or on behalf of the party making the same; (ii) shall be deemed given or delivered (a) if delivered personally, when received, (b) if sent from within the United States by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, on the third business day after mailing, or (c) if sent by messenger or reputable overnight courier service, on the next business day after mailing; and (iii) shall be addressed to each party at its address set forth in this Agreement, or at such other address as the parties shall designate in writing by personal delivery, certified mail, or overnight courier service.
- 10. <u>Disputes.</u> The COUNTY's Authorized Representative will be the initial interpreter of the requirements of this Agreement and will determine the acceptability of the work to be provided hereunder. All claims, disputes and other matters relating to the acceptability of the work must be referred to the COUNTY's Authorized Representative in writing with a request that a formal decision be made within a reasonable period of time. Written notice of each claim, dispute or other matter must be delivered to the COUNTY's Authorized Representative within 30 days of the occurrence of the event giving rise to the claim, dispute or other matter. All data supporting the claim, dispute or other matter must be submitted to the COUNTY's Authorized Representative within 45 days of the event, unless the COUNTY's Authorized Representative allows for additional time based on the availability of complete and accurate data. The COUNTY shall continue to perform while the claim or dispute is pending. The issuance of a decision by the COUNTY's Authorized Representative shall be a condition precedent to the CITY's exercise of the rights and remedies the CITY may have under this Agreement or at law with respect to the claim, dispute or other matter.

11. Termination.

With Cause. This Agreement may be suspended or terminated by either party if any of the terms or conditions of this Agreement are violated. In the event either party exercises its right to terminate this Agreement, the terminating party shall submit written notice to the other party specifying the extent of the termination and the reasons therefore, and the date upon which termination becomes effective.

Without Cause. Either party may terminate this Agreement without cause by giving at least 90 days written notice to the other party. Upon receipt of a notice of such termination, the COUNTY shall take all action necessary to discontinue work pursuant to the Agreement.

<u>Payment upon Termination</u>. The COUNTY shall be entitled to payment for all work satisfactorily performed.

If the CITY should cancel this Agreement, as above provided, before the completion of the then current property assessment by the COUNTY, the CITY agrees to defend and hold the COUNTY, its officials, officers, agents, employees and duly authorized volunteers harmless from any liability that might ensue as a result of the non-completion of a property tax assessment.

- 12. <u>Survival</u>. The provisions of this Agreement which, by their terms, impose obligations that are continuing in nature and which must survive in order to give effect to their meaning will survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement, including, without limitation, the following clauses: Indemnification; Records and Information; Governing Law; Jurisdiction; Venue.
- 13. Entire Agreement; Amendments; Conflicts. This Agreement (including the exhibits attached hereto) constitutes the entire agreement and understanding of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous agreements, documents and proposals, oral or written, between the parties with respect thereto. Any amendment or modification to this Agreement shall not be valid unless such amendment or modification (i) is in writing and signed by authorized representatives of both parties and (ii) references this Agreement. The terms and conditions of the exhibits are integral parts of this Agreement and are fully incorporated herein by this reference.
- 14. Compliance with Applicable Law. The COUNTY agrees to comply with applicable federal, state and local laws or ordinances, and applicable rules, regulations, and standards established by any agency of such governmental units, which are now or hereafter promulgated insofar as they relate to the COUNTY's performance of the provisions of this Agreement. It shall be the obligation of the COUNTY to apply for, pay for and obtain all permits and/or licenses required by any governmental agency for the provision of those services contemplated herein.
- 15. Governing Law; Jurisdiction; Venue. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Minnesota, without regard to its conflict of laws rules. For the purpose of resolving conflicts related to or arising out of this Agreement, the parties expressly agree that venue shall be exclusively in the State of Minnesota, County of Redwood. The parties hereby expressly consent to the exclusive personal jurisdiction of the federal and state courts located in the State of Minnesota, regardless of the citizenship or residency of either party at the time of the commencement of any legal proceeding.
- 16. Equal Employment Opportunity. In connection with the execution of this Agreement, the COUNTY agrees that it will comply with Minn. State § 363A.08, to not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, creed, religion,

- national original, sex, marital status, status with regard to public assistance, membership or activity in a local commission, disability, sexual orientation, or age.
- 17. Conflict of Interest. The parties affirms that, to the best of their knowledge, this Agreement does not result in a conflict of interest with any party or entity, which may be affected by the terms of this Agreement. The parties agrees that, should any conflict or potential conflict of interest become known to the parties, they will immediately notify the other party of the conflict or potential conflict, specifying the part of this Agreement giving rise to the conflict or potential conflict.
- 18. <u>Severability</u>. In the event that any portion of this Agreement shall be held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Agreement.
- 19. Execution. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and to constitute one and the same instrument. Electronic copies of this Agreement, including without limitation, those transmitted by facsimile or scanned to an image file, shall be considered originals.

ATTACHMENT A ALTERNATIVE DISPUTE RESOLUTION PROCEDURES

Definitions:

- 1. Negotiation: Two or more people meet voluntarily to discuss an issue.
- 2. **Mediation:** A negotiation process involving a third party neutral who facilitates the discussions. The mediator has no decision-making authority.
- 3. Arbitration: A more formal process involving an arbitrator who has decision-making authority.

Procedures:

In the event of initiation of Alternative Dispute Resolution under the Joint Powers Agreement, the parties to the dispute agree to attempt to resolve their dispute by following the process described below.

- The Board or County shall provide written response to the notice within seven (7) days of receipt
 of notice.
- 2. The parties shall meet with a neutral facilitator within 14 days of receipt of the response.
- 3. At the first meeting, the neutral facilitator shall assist the parties in identifying the appropriate parties and participants in the dispute resolution process, their concerns, a meeting agenda and design for any subsequent meetings. The parties shall agree on a process for resolving the problem that would involve additional negotiations, mediation or arbitration.
- 4. In developing the process, the parties shall be guided by the following principles
 - a. The parties shall attempt in good faith to reach a negotiated settlement.
 - The parties agree that there must be fair representation of the parties directly involved in the dispute.
 - c. The parties shall use legal proceedings as a last resort.
 - d. In the event the parties are unable to resolve the dispute, each party retains all rights, remedies or defenses it had prior to entering the process.
- 5. The parties will report to the Board within 60 days of their first meeting on the resolution of the dispute or a recommendation to commence legal or other proceedings.

Section 7: Alternative Dispute Resolution. The Counties and the Board agree to participate in the alternative dispute resolution procedures in Attachment A if mutual agreement cannot be reached regarding issues arising under this agreement, and if requested by resolution of a member County, except as to any issue arising under provisions set forth in Article X.

Section 8: Addition of New Members. Additional Counties may become a party to this Agreement through an amendment pursuant to Section 1, herein, or by contractual arrangements. New member Counties must agree, as a condition of becoming a party to this Agreement, to abide by the terms of the contract and/or conditions unanimously set by the Board.

ARTICLE XIV Effective Date

The effective date of this Agreement shall be the 1st of February, 2023.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the member County Boards, by resolution, have caused this Agreement to be executed by their respective officers.

Section 3: Termination. This Agreement shall remain in full force and effect until terminated by either party by giving 180 days written notice to the other party of their intention to withdraw from the terms of this Agreement. If such a notice is given, the remaining County may, in its discretion, purchase the withdrawing County's interest in the real and RRRSWA property owned by the parties pursuant to this Agreement. If the parties cannot agree on the purchase price and/or the method of payment, the parties shall submit this matter to mandatory arbitration. Each party shall select an arbitrator and pay him/her. The two selected arbitrators, pursuant to the Rules of the American Arbitration Association, shall hear and decide the issues presented to them which may include, without limitation, the purchase price and method of payment for the parties' jointly owned property. The arbitrators' decision shall be binding and final. If either County wishes to purchase the assets jointly owned by the parties pursuant to this Agreement, such assets shall be sold to the County which desires to make such a purchase and the proceeds of the sales used to pay any and all debts and obligations of the Board. Any proceeds remaining after the payment of all debt shall be distributed in proportion to the party's respective ownership interest as set forth above. The Board shall approve the final report of its activities and affairs prior to the effective date of termination.

ARTICLE XIII Miscellaneous

Section 1: Amendments. This Agreement may be amended only in writing and upon the consent of each of the Boards of Commissioners of the Counties. Notice of any proposed amendment must be provided to all participating County Boards of Commissioners at least 30 days prior to the effective date of the proposed amendment.

<u>Section 2: Assignment.</u> Neither party may assign their interest in this Agreement to any other party without the express written consent of the other party.

Section 3: Records, Accounts and Reports. The Board shall establish and maintain such funds and accounts as may be required by good accounting practices. The books and records of the Board shall be subject to the provisions of Minnesota Statute Chapter 13, the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, and shall be maintained in accordance with any auditing requirements of the State of Minnesota. The Board, within 120 days after the close of each fiscal year, which shall be January 1 to December 31, shall give a complete written report of all financial activities for such fiscal year to the parties.

Section 4: Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.

Section 5: Severability, The provisions of this Agreement are severable. If any paragraph, section, subdivision, sentence, clause, or phrase of the Agreement is for any reason held to be contrary to law, or contrary to any rule or regulation having the force and effect of law, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Agreement.

Section 6: Entire Agreement. This Agreement contains the entire Agreement of the Counties and shall supersede all oral and written agreements and negotiations by the Counties relating to the subject matter of this Agreement.

Statutes, Section 471.59, subdivision la(b); provided further that for purposes of that statute, each Party to this Agreement expressly declines responsibility for the acts or omissions of the other Party.

The Parties of this agreement are not liable for the acts or omissions of the other participants to this Agreement except to the extent to which they have agreed in writing to be responsible for acts or omissions of the other Parties.

ARTICLE XI Non-Performance

The Board may determine by resolution that a member County has not performed one or more of its material obligations as a party to this Agreement. Such obligations may include, but are not limited to, payment of assessments or the failure to satisfy any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement. Prior to adopting such a resolution, the Board must provide the County with 30 days written notice of its intent to do so, and shall provide that County an opportunity to be heard on the matter. Within 30 days after the adoption of the resolution by the Board, the Member County that is the subject of the determination shall notify the Board of its intentions to pursue one or more of the following options.

- A. Request additional time to perform the obligation.
- B. Negotiate a new or amended obligation.
- Request alternative dispute resolution according to the procedures set forth in Attachment A.
- D. Perform the obligation.

ARTICLE XII Withdrawal and Termination

Section 1: Withdrawal. Any party may withdraw from this Agreement upon the following conditions: (a) No withdrawal shall be effective until January 1 of the next calendar year following the year in which notice of withdrawal was provided; (b) Written notice of withdrawal shall be provided to the Board no later than June 1st in the year prior to the effective date of the withdrawal; and (c) No withdrawal shall be effective until the withdrawing County provides a showing that the payment of all assessments due and owed have been paid. Notice shall be a certified copy of a resolution of its Board of Commissioners indicating its intent to withdraw from this Agreement. Upon receipt of the resolution, the Chair of the Board shall forward a copy of the resolution to each of the Counties. In the event of withdrawal by any member County, this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect as to all remaining member Counties.

Section 2: Effect of Withdrawal. Withdrawal by any County shall not terminate this Agreement. Withdrawal shall not act to discharge any liability incurred or chargeable to any County before the effective date of withdrawal. Such liability shall continue until appropriately discharged by law or agreement. No County shall be entitled to a refund of assessments paid, or forgiveness of such assessments owed to the Board, unless otherwise provided for in an agreement allocating Special Project Costs among the participating Counties. A withdrawing County must pay the full amount of any match necessary to complete any Special Project in which the withdrawing County participated.

County or presents a risk of civil litigation for their County. The Counties shall be assessed for Special Projects according to the procedures set forth herein for those portions of the approved budget designated as "Special Project Costs." Special Project Costs shall include all costs incurred in the planning, development and implementation of specific, multi-County projects determined by the Board to be Special Projects. The assessment formula for Special Project Costs shall be prorated based upon the benefitted population of the Counties participating in the project, or under another formula determined by the Counties participating in the Special Project. Non-participating Counties shall not be assessed any portion of a Special Project Cost.

If the Board incurs any expenses as a result of a claim for damages resulting from a Special Project, the expenses and damages shall be assessed against the County or Counties participating in the Special Project pursuant to the Special Project Cost formula determined above.

Section 5: Time of Payment: Review, All assessments made under the provisions of this Article shall be paid by each County within sixty (60) days of receipt of written notice of the assessment. Payment by any County shall not be construed as a waiver of the right to review the amount or the basis for the assessment. Any County may request such a review, after payment of the assessment, by the Board. The Board shall hear the parties upon request, and make such modifications in the assessment to any County as are appropriate under the circumstances. If the request for review is not satisfactorily resolved before the Board, the aggreeved County or Counties may make a request for alternative dispute resolution pursuant to the procedures in Attachment A, which is hereby incorporated into and made a part of this Agreement.

Section 6: Accountability for Funds. All funds shall be accounted for according to generally accepted accounting principles. A report on all receipts and disbursements shall be forwarded to the Board of County Commissioners of each County on an annual basis, in accordance with Article IX, Section 2.

ARTICLE X Indemnification and Hold Harmless

Section 1: Applicability. The Redwood/Renville Regional Solid Waste Authority shall be considered a separate and distinct public entity to which the Parties have transferred all responsibility and control for actions taken pursuant to this agreement. The Redwood/Renville Regional Solid Waste Authority shall comply with all laws and rules that govern a public entity in the State of Minnesota and shall be entitled to the protections of Minnesota Statute 466.

Section 2: Indemnification and Hold Harmless. The Redwood/Renville Regional Solid Waste Authority shall fully defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Parties against all claims, losses, liability, suits, judgments, costs and expenses by reason of the action or inaction of the Board and/or employees and/or the agents of the Redwood/Renville Regional Solid Waste Authority. This agreement to indemnify and hold harmless does not constitute a waiver by any participant of limitations on liability provided under Minnesota Statutes, Section 466.04.

To the full extent permitted by law, actions by the Parties pursuant to this Agreement are intended to be and shall be construed as a "cooperative activity" and it is the intent of the Parties that they shall be deemed a "single government unit" for the purpose of liability, as set forth in Minnesota

The Executive Director shall serve as the Chief Executive Officer of the Redwood/Renville Solid Waste Authority and shall have general supervision over the administration of its business and affairs, subject to the direction of the Joint Powers Board.

Section 3: Additional Staff. Additional staff may be authorized by action of the Joint Powers Board. The Executive Director shall oversee the activities of all staff. Subordinate employee's job descriptions, duties, responsibilities, and performance will be established and reviewed by the Executive Director as needed. Decisions such as compensation, benefits, and the recommendation to discipline and or fire an employee will be documented by the Executive Director and brought to the financial host County for resolution.

ARTICLE VIII Exercise of Power

All powers granted herein shall be exercised by the Board in a fiscally responsible manner and in accordance with the requirements of the law. The Board will follow all purchasing and contracting requirements in accordance with Minnesota Statute 471.59, subdivision 3, and Minnesota Statutes Chapter 400.

ARTICLE IX Annual Budget

Section 1: Budgeting: The Board shall approve the annual budget and submit it as required to meet the timing needs of each party during its annual budget cycle. The proposed budget shall be presented in reasonable detail, and summary information concerning individual items shall be supplemented upon request of either County Board. The parties shall set the budget in the amount recommended by the Board.

Section 2: Handling of Accounting. The County designated by the Board as Financial Host shall be responsible for receiving and disbursing all funds received by the Board. The parties hereto shall, in proportion to their respective shares of ownership of the assets of this joint venture as set forth herein, indemnify and hold said member County harmless from any member County may have done or failed to do while performing this service on behalf of the Board.

Section 3: County Assessment. The Counties shall be assessed in a manner to be determined by the Board. It is intended by agreement of the Counties that all budget assessments approved by the Board shall be in equal amounts to each County, except in the instance of a Special Project as described in Article IX, Section 4. The assessment method may, from time to time, be amended using the same procedure described herein. The Counties shall agree that complete and timely payment of such assessment to the Board shall be absolute, irrevocable, and unconditional notwithstanding the provisions of Article XII, Withdrawal and Termination.

Section 4: Special Projects. The Board may undertake to develop and implement projects that benefit a subset of the Counties party to this Agreement ("Special Projects"). All Special Projects must be approved by the County Board that will be assessed for the Special Project. In determining whether to ratify a Special Project approved by the Board, the County Boards of Commissioners may consider whether such ratification has the potential to financially obligate their

office equipment maintenance, and other necessary services. The Board will contract with a single County for their services as Financial Host, and for the services of an Executive Director to perform the functions and duties set forth herein. The Board will contract for other employees as it deems reasonable and necessary.

- Furnish recommendations at such times as the Board deems necessary and proper regarding the following:
 - Establishment and /or modification of waste management service areas, as defined in Minnesota Statute 400.08, within the Counties of Redwood and Renville:
 - Imposition of service charges and/ or levy of taxes within such service areas in furtherance of the purposes of this Agreement;
 - c. The manner and timing of collection of such charges as the parties may impose in furtherance of this agreement in a manner that is consistent with Minnesota Statute 400.08, Subdivision 4;
 - d. Establishment or modification of ordinances to be adopted by the parties hereto regarding solid waste management for the purposes set forth in Minnesota Statute 400.16;
 - e. Establishment and/or modification of ordinances to be adopted by the parties hereto regarding identification, labeling, collection, processing, storage and disposal of hazardous waste and special wastes for the purposes set forth in Minnesota Statute 400.161
 - f. Maintain a solid waste management fund within the designated financial host County treasury for the purposes set forth in Minnesota Statute 400.13

ARTICLE VI Reservation of Authority

All powers and responsibilities not specifically set out to be jointly exercised by the Board under this Agreement are hereby reserved to the Counties.

ARTICLE VII Powers and Duties of Board Employees

Section 1: Employees. Exact job titles, duties, responsibilities, and any recommendations will be voted on and approved by the Board. For the purpose of this document, employees of RRRSWA will be considered to be employees of the County determined by the Joint Powers Board to be the financial host. Employees will be subject to the financial host County's policies, procedures, benefits, salary and personnel policy.

Section 2: Executive Director. If the Board elects to utilize the services of an Executive Director, such Executive Director may function as the recording secretary and reporting treasurer for the Board. The Joint Powers Board has the authority to appoint and terminate the services of an Executive Director. The Chair and Vice-Chair will perform the initial review of the performance of the Executive Director on an annual basis, with the assistance and involvement of the Renville County HR Coordinator. The entire Board shall then review their recommendation and make a recommendation to the financial host county for any recommended compensation adjustments .

Section 8: Committees. The Board may establish standing committees of the Board. The Chair may establish ad hoc committees, advisory committees, and task forces as needed for the purpose of receiving public input. If a Citizens Advisory Committee is formed, such committee shall be comprised of one citizen from each County and one at-large member, who will be chosen from an appropriate pool of individuals residing in either Redwood County or Renville County. This at-large member shall have experience or expertise in solid waste management and/or public health matters. The Counties shall agree as to the appropriate method for determining and choosing the Citizens Advisory Committee and the at-large member. The Citizens Advisory Committee members will not have voting authority, but will participate in all Board meetings. Advisory Committee members will be entitled to the same compensation as voting members of the Board.

ARTICLE V Powers and Duties of the Board

The Redwood/Renville Regional Solid Waste Board shall have the power and authority necessary and needed to satisfy the purposes of this Agreement, except as reserved in this Agreement, and it shall be the duty of the Board to exercise such powers in furtherance of such powers. Specifically, the Board may and shall:

- Maintain and operate a fully integrated solid waste management system, together with any and all real and personal property jointly owned by the parties hereto in furtherance of the purposes stated herein.
- Devise, implement, administer, and operate any recycling program, as defined in Minnesota Statute 115A.03, Subd. 25b, Recycling, or other source reduction program which it may deem appropriate and advisable, and to prepare and present requests and recommendations to the parties hereto for any ordinances or resolutions necessary to such program.
- 3. Administer, operate and maintain any municipal solid waste transfer station or other source reduction program which it may deem critical and necessary for the purposes of this Agreement, and to prepare and present requests and recommendations to the parties hereto for any ordinances or resolutions necessary to such program.
- Purchase and lease material, equipment, machinery, and such other personal property as is necessary for the purposes hereof, subject to the Uniform Municipal Contracting Law as set forth in Minnesota Statue 471.345.
- 5. Sell, lease, convey or otherwise dispose of any RRRSWA property held for solid waste management purposes, upon determination that it is no longer needed for such purposes, or, upon approval of both parties hereto, may transfer such property to either party hereto for any other lawful County purposes. Property disposed of pursuant to this provision shall be sold, leased, and conveyed upon advertisement for bids in accordance with Minnesota Statute 373.01.
- Contract for services necessary to further the purposes of this Agreement, including but not limited to legal, management, planning, facility, employment, maintenance,

Board of Commissioners and two members shall be appointed by the Renville County Board of Commissioners. Each County shall also appoint one alternate member, who when attending a meeting in the place of one of the two appointed members of the Board for that county, shall have all of the powers and duties of the appointed member of the Board. The members appointed by each County shall be duly elected County Commissioners seated in the appointing County. The Board of Commissioners of each County shall appoint its representatives to the Board. The Counties shall make such appointments at their annual organizational meetings conducted pursuant to Minnesota Statute 375.07.

<u>Section 2: Terms.</u> Representatives shall serve two year terms. Removal of any County representative during the term for which the representative has been appointed may be done at any time, but shall be done only by action of the appointing Board of Commissioners.

Section 3: Vacancies. If an appointment of any representative Commissioner is vacated before the end of the term, the vacancy shall be filled by appointment by the appropriate appointing Board of Commissioners. Vacancies shall be filled within thirty (30) days of occurrence. A vacancy shall be deemed to have occurred when any of the conditions specified in Minnesota Statute 351.02 exist, or if a representative fails to qualify or act as a Commissioner.

Section 4: Election of Officers. Notwithstanding any other provision herein, the Redwood/Renville Regional Solid Waste Board shall meet at least annually. At the first meeting following January 1 in each year, the Board shall by majority vote elect a Chair and Vice-Chair. The term of each of these officers shall be for one calendar year, but each officer shall continue in his or her elected capacity until a successor is elected and qualified. The Chair shall be responsible for running the meetings, and in the absence of the chair, the Vice-Chair shall perform this function.

Section 5: Conduct of Meetings. The Board shall have regular meetings at such times and places as the Board shall determine. Special meetings may be held on notice by the Chair or a simple majority of County representatives given at least three working days prior to such special meeting. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum. The procedure followed at Board meetings will be based on but not bound by Roberts Rules of Order, as modified by the ordinary practice of the Board. Each member of the Board shall be entitled to one vote and any action taken by the Board shall be approved by majority vote.

The parties hereto acknowledge that the Board is an agent of the governmental entities that are parties hereto. It is agreed that all meetings of the Board must conform to the notice and distribution of information requirements of Minnesota Statute 13D.

Section 6: Compensation of Board. The Board shall annually recommend the amount of compensation to be paid to each member hereto which shall be submitted as a line item within the Board's annual budget recommendation. All citizen advisory members appointed to the Board shall be compensated by the RRRSWA at a uniform rate. Commissioners shall be compensated by their respective counties.

<u>Section 7: Legal Matters.</u> Legal matters of the Board will be managed by a County Attorney of one of the parties appointed by the Board annually at the first organizational meeting, or by outside counsel retained by the Board to provide legal services.

- C. "Counties" means the Counties that are parties to this Agreement.
- D. "Facility" means the recycling/transfer facility in Redwood County, Minnesota.
- E. "Parties" means Redwood and Renville County.
- F. "Program" means the integrated solid waste management program intended by the Counties to be created by this Agreement.
- G. "Transfer station" means an intermediate waste facility in which materials collected from any source is temporarily deposited to await transportation to another material handling facility.
- H. "Special Projects" means any event, collection or endeavor that is specifically held to benefit a particular segment of the combined County area, such as a Township, individual City or a single member County. Example: Extensive educational efforts or materials for a County Fair, City Celebration, school program or private entity.

ARTICLE II Purnoses

This Agreement has been executed by the Counties for the purpose of assisting in the accomplishment of the solid waste management goals outlined in Minnesota Statutes (specifically Minnesota Statute Chapters 115A and 400) and related waste management and public health statutes.

The purpose of this agreement shall be to provide for the joint operation and management of an integrated solid waste system, to furnish solid waste management planning services for the parties hereto; and to enhance the capacity of the parties hereto in the enforcement of all laws, ordinances, and resolutions regulating the generation, storage, transportation, and disposal of solid waste in Redwood and Renville Counties.

ARTICLE III

Term

The term of this Agreement shall commence on _______, 20___ and shall continue in full force and effect until terminated by the parties pursuant to Article XII, Section 3 of this Agreement.

ARTICLE IV Regional Solid Waste Board

Section 1: Creation and Composition. A joint powers Board, known as the Redwood/Renville Regional Solid Waste Board (hereinafter the "Board"), is established for the purposes contained herein with the powers and duties set forth in this Agreement. The Board shall consist of four appointed individuals. Two members shall be appointed by the Redwood County

THIS JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT made this _____ of _____, 2022, between the counties of Redwood and Renville which are both political subdivisions of the State of Minnesota.

WHEREAS, the parties previously entered into a JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT FOR SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT dated the 1st day of January 2012 and updated on the 27th day of December, 2016; and

WHEREAS, each County has waste management authority and responsibilities under Minnesota Statute Chapters 115A, 400 and related waste management and public health statutes; and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency pursuant to the Waste Management Act and Minnesota Statue 115A.46 have established Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Planning and Certificate of Need Rules that require Counties to develop County Solid Waste Plans; and

WHEREAS, the Counties have determined that the most appropriate mechanism for addressing regional needs is the Board as authorized and described herein; and

WHEREAS, the parties to this agreement are authorized to jointly conduct solid waste planning and management activities pursuant to MN Stat 400.04 and 471.59; and

WHEREAS, the participating County Boards desire to improve the planning and coordination of Solid Waste Management Services within the multi-county area covered by this agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and mutual agreements contained herein, and pursuant to the forgoing, the Counties do hereby establish the Redwood/Renville Solid Waste Authority, having the composition, powers, and duties provided in this agreement as follows:

ARTICLE I Definitions

Section 1: Statutory Definitions. The definitions of terms contained in Minnesota Statute, Chapters 115A, 116 and 400 shall apply in this Agreement where those terms are used.

<u>Section 2: Additional Definitions.</u> In the interpretation of this Agreement, the following additional definitions shall have the meanings given to them.

- A. "Board" means the joint powers Board created by this Agreement.
- B. "Commissioner" means a duly elected, qualified and acting County Commissioner of a

Another summer, another busy year.

As I reflect back on what the STS program Accomplished, it is amazing what all the different projects we have worked on such as the painting projects at the local schools and Vesta Community Center, the lawn mowing and maintenance at the Museum and at the Gilfillan Estate. All of the cleaning and picking up of construction debris inside and outside of the new Justice Center almost on a weekly basis since late winter up to opening up to the public for business.

Four miles of highway pick-up equal eight ditch miles is done yearly also.

And the biggest project is of course Plum Creek Park.

STS does all of the repair and painting of approximately 30 picnic tables per year, cutting, splitting and bundling firewood, Cleaning, sanitizing and maintaining the Rest Rooms all summer, Empting garbage barrels, raking and picking up branches. Entire Campground was raked five times this summer due to high winds, along with the high winds than we also did a lot of tree trimming because of broken branches. Other trimming includes weed whipping around all of the bathrooms, office, wood shed, picnic shelters, cabins, fire rings, Ballfield fences, parking lot post. With over 1 mile of Dogwood bushes to trim and clean-up in the campground yearly is a big project. Tore out a 3 strand Barb-wire fence along the road leading up toward the office. Installed a culvert in a wash-out that now allows access to an area that can be maintained for mowing and fallen tree removal.

In the last 4 years we have cut down well over 100 Pine Trees due to a blight that causes the trees to turn brown and die, so we have been trying to slow down the spread of the blight by removing and burning them.

The STS program could not accomplish these projects without the great work of the Clients. I have been very fortunate to have some really good workers on my crews, granted there are a few that are a waste of time and don't last long on the crew, but I can't help those who don't want to help themselves.

As I close out this Year, I would like to thank you, the County Commissioners for believing in the Sentence to Service Program that allows clients to give back to society and hopefully feel better about themselves. Also I would like to Thank Randy and his jail staff for getting clients ready to go out for the day and making sack lunches. For all of this I am truly grateful.

WHEREAS, Redwood County ("County") received Federal Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds under the American Rescue Plan Act ("ARP"), to provide relief to the county impacted by the coronavirus disease 2019 ("COVID-19");

WHEREAS, Redwood County Commissioners have identified a necessary expense support the Redwood County Ag Society for the 2023 150th Redwood County Fair;

WHEREAS, the authority under the ARP Act allows this expenditure, per the Final Rule published on January 6, 2022, 31 C.F.R § 35

 $\S35.6(d)$ Providing government services. A recipient may use funds for the provision of government services to the extent of the reduction in the recipient's general revenue due to the public health emergency, calculated according to this paragraph (d). A recipient must make a one-time election to calculate the amount of the reduction in the recipient's general revenue due to the public health emergency according to either paragraph (d)(1) or (d)(2) of this section:

§35.6(d)(1) Standard allowance. The reduction in the recipient's general revenue due to the public health emergency over the period of performance will be deemed to be ten million dollars; or

WHEREAS, The Redwood County Board of Commissioners voted to authorize Redwood County to expend American Rescue Plan Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds utilizing the Standard (Revenue Loss) Allowance at their Regular Board Meeting held on March 1, 2022;

WHEREAS, at the August 16, 2022 Board of Commissioners Board meeting a one-time appropriation of \$30,000 was unanimously authorized for the Redwood County Ag Society to be used for the 2023 150^{th} Redwood County Fair set for July 13 - 16, 2023;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the County Board of Commissioners is authorizing the disbursement of \$30,000 to the Redwood County Ag Society to be used or the 2023 150th Redwood County Fair set for July 13 – 16, 2023, and certifies that the funds appropriated from the ARP Act fund will be used only in a manner consistent with the Department of the U.S. Treasury guidance and incurred during the covered period.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption on January 17, 2023.

REDWOOD COUNTY AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this	day of	, 2023 (the "Effective
Date") by and between the County of Redwood, a political st	ubdivision of the State of Min	nesota (the "County"), 403
South Mill Street, Redwood, Minnesota 56283, and Southwe	est Minnesota Housing Partner	rship (the "Consultant"), 2401
Broadway Avenue, Slayton, Minnesota 56172.		

WHEREAS, the County Economic Development Authority ("EDA") is in need of administrative services for the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development Small Cities Community Development Block Grant Coronavirus Broadband Grant (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Consultant meets the needs of the County and is willing to provide the services provided for in this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the County wishes to purchase the services from the Consultant pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and understandings contained herein, the County and Consultant enter into the following Agreement:

AGREEMENT

1. TERM.

Notwithstanding the date of the signatures of the parties to this Agreement, the term of this Agreement shall commence on the Effective Date and, unless earlier terminated pursuant to this Agreement, shall terminate on the date that all obligations have been fulfilled and all deliverables have been approved by the County. The Consultant shall not commence work on the Project until the County's Authorized Representative issues a written notice to proceed.

DUTIES OF THE CONSULTANT.

- 2.1 <u>Nature of Duties.</u> The Consultant shall provide the various professional and consulting services for the Project as set forth in the Consultant's Scope of Services attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and incorporated into this Agreement by reference. The Consultant shall confer with the County's Authorized Representative as often as is necessary in connection with the services to be performed under this Agreement.
- 2.2 <u>Personnel</u>. All work the Consultant is to perform shall be performed by competent and qualified personnel. Jen Theneman, Director of Real Estate and Community Development will have primary responsibility for performing the work under this Agreement on behalf of the Consultant and will serve as the Consultant's primary contact with the County. The Consultant shall not change the person primarily responsible for performing the work under this Agreement without the prior written approval of the County's Authorized Representative.
- 2.3 <u>Project Timing</u>. The Consultant shall not start work on the Project until the Consultant has received from the County's Authorized Representative written notice to proceed. All work and services required by this Agreement shall be completed in accordance with the schedule attached hereto as **Exhibit B**. The Consultant acknowledges that the time within which services must be rendered is of primary importance to the County and is of the essence to this Agreement. All services and information to be performed or furnished under this Agreement shall be performed or furnished as promptly as possible.
- 2.4 <u>Final Documents</u>. The Consultant shall provide all documentation of the work to be performed under this Agreement. The documents shall be furnished in a format acceptable to the County. Upon completion of the

work, the Consultant shall also deliver to the County copies of all correspondence, drawings, reports and all other documents either generated by or received by the Consultant in the performance of the work and services required by this Agreement.

2.5 <u>Standard of Care and Liability for Work</u>. In performing the work under this Agreement, the Consultant will use that degree of care, knowledge and skill ordinarily exercised by other reputable professionals in the field under like circumstances within the State of Minnesota.

3. ITEMS PROVIDED BY THE COUNTY.

After authorizing the Consultant to begin work, the County will furnish any data or materials in its possession relating to the Project that may be of use to the Consultant in performing the work. The Consultant shall make an analysis of all data and information furnished by the County. If any data or information is found to be incorrect or incomplete by the Consultant, this fact shall be brought to the attention of the County's Authorized Representative before the Consultant proceeds with any affected portion of the Project. All data or materials provided to the Consultant will remain the property of the County and must promptly be returned to the County upon expiration or termination of this Agreement.

4. PAYMENT TO CONSULTANT.

- Rates and Contract Maximum. For services satisfactorily completed in accordance with this Agreement, the County shall pay the Consultant in accordance with the project amounts specified in **Exhibit C**. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, the total compensation payable to the Consultant for services and expenses under this Agreement shall not exceed \$53,000 (the "Contract Maximum). \$50,000 of the Contract Maximum will be paid to Consultant for the services outlined in **Exhibit A**. The only other allowable expense under this Agreement is mileage for SWMHP to travel from its office locations to the construction site twice per month. The mileage rate shall be paid at the current federally set rate and billed to County as outlined in Section 4.3. In the event the County requests services that would require payment in excess of the Contract Maximum, the Consultant shall not proceed until such time as the County has approved such modification or addition by written amendment to this Agreement.
- 4.2 <u>Payment of Costs.</u> Reimbursable expenses are included in the project amounts specified in **Exhibit C**. No additional charges for expenses or reimbursements will be allowed without the prior written authorization of the County's Authorized Representative.
- 4.3 <u>Billing by Consultant</u>. The amounts to be paid under this Agreement shall be paid only if work has been satisfactorily performed as determined by the County's Authorized Representative and consistent with the amounts set forth in **Exhibit C**. The Consultant shall submit an invoice monthly in a form acceptable to the County's Authorized Representatives.
- 4.4 Payment by County. Within thirty-five (35) days of the approval of the invoice by the County, the County shall mail payment of the approved amount to the Consultant for all services satisfactorily performed or make reasonable arrangements for payment acceptable to the Consultant. No claim for expenses or services not specifically provided for herein shall be honored by the County. Amounts disputed need not be paid until the dispute is resolved. Final payment due to the Consultant will be made by the County when all work and services have been satisfactorily performed and all documents have been delivered to the County in accordance with this Agreement. All payments shall be issued to:

AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE.

Briana Mumme, Economic Development Coordinator shall serve as the Authorized Representative of the County and as the liaison with the Consultant. The County shall have the right to change its Authorized Representative from time to time and shall inform the Consultant of any such change. The Authorized Representative shall have the express authority to make all contacts with the Consultant on behalf of the County and to instruct the Consultant to perform the various services described in this Agreement. The Consultant shall submit reports, invoices and other materials prepared pursuant to this Agreement to the County's Authorized Representative, by mailing or delivering them to:

6. RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE PARTIES.

- 6.1 <u>Independent Contractor.</u> Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as creating the relationship of copartners, joint ventures, or an association, nor shall the Consultant, be considered an employee, agent or representative of the County. The Consultant is to be and shall remain an independent contractor with respect to all services performed under this Agreement.
- 6.2 <u>No Agency</u>. Consultant shall have the authority to act on behalf of the County only to the extent expressly provided for in this Agreement, unless otherwise modified by the parties in writing.

7. INSURANCE AND INDEMNIFICATION.

- 7.1 <u>Insurance</u>. Consultant shall comply with the insurance requirements set forth in **Exhibit D**, attached to this Agreement and incorporated herein by reference.
- 7.2 <u>Indemnification by Consultant</u>. Consultant agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the County and its officers, officials, agents, volunteers and employees from any liability, claims, losses, damages, costs, judgments, or expenses, including reasonable attorneys' and other professional fees, resulting directly or indirectly from any negligent, tortious or illegal act or omission, including without limitation, professional errors or omissions by the Consultant arising from the performance of its services pursuant to this Agreement, and against all loss by reason of the failure of the Consultant to fully to perform all obligations under this Agreement. For clarification and not by way of limitation, this obligation to indemnify and hold harmless shall apply to all materials prepared or furnished pursuant to this Agreement, including, without limitation, and the unlawful disclosure or use of protected data or other noncompliance with the Records and Information provisions set forth in Section 8. The terms and provisions of this Section 7 shall survive the expiration, suspension or termination of this Agreement.
- 7.3 Indemnification by County. County agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Consultant from any liability, claims, losses, damages, costs, judgments, or expenses, including reasonable attorneys' and other professional fees, resulting directly or indirectly from any negligent, tortious or illegal act or omission by the County (including its officers, employees, agents and subcontractors) arising from the terms of this Agreement, and against all loss by reason of the failure of the County, its agents, employees or subcontractors fully to perform all obligations under this Agreement. For clarification and not by way of limitation, this obligation to indemnify and hold harmless shall apply to all materials prepared or furnished pursuant to this Agreement, including, without limitation, the unlawful disclosure or use of protected data or other noncompliance with the Records and Information provisions set forth in Section 8. The terms and provisions of this Section 7 shall survive the expiration, suspension or termination of this Agreement.

8. RECORDS AND INFORMATION.

8.1 Ownership of Documents, Intellectual Property Rights and Confidentiality. All documents, reports, recommendations, and other work prepared or furnished by Consultant pursuant to this Agreement are work

products of the County and shall be the property of the County. Consultant represents and certifies that the works and documents created and paid for under this Agreement do not and will not infringe upon any intellectual property rights of other persons or entities. Consultant shall furnish the County with all products upon completion of the work, and at any other time as requested by the County. Consultant may retain copies of all such work products and related documents, but Consultant may not use the work products and related documents for any purpose not related to the Project without the County's consent. No reports, documents, or other information that are generated under this Agreement shall be released by Consultant except as required to be released by the Minnesota Data Practices Act or with the approval of the Authorized Representative.

- 8.2 <u>Data Practices</u>. The Consultant must comply with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act (Minnesota Statutes Chapter 13) as it applies to all data provided to the Consultant by the County under this Agreement and as it applies to all data created, collected, received, stored, used, maintained, or disseminated by Consultant pursuant to this Agreement. If the Consultant receives a request to release data pursuant to this Section 8.2, the Consultant shall notify the County immediately and consult with the County as to how the Consultant should respond to the request. The Consultant's response shall comply with applicable law.
- 8.3 Private and Confidential Data. The Consultant shall comply with the provisions of the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act (Minnesota Statutes Ch. 13) and all other applicable state and federal laws, rules and regulations relating to data privacy or confidentiality, which may include the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA and/or the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act (HITECH). Consultant further acknowledges that the classification of data as trade secret data will be determined based on applicable law, and labeling data as trade secret data will not necessarily make it so.
- 8.4 <u>County Network Connection</u>. Consultant acknowledges that this Agreement does not authorize Consultant to make any connection to the County's network through the use of any hardware or through a Virtual Private Network (VPN). In the event a VPN or other network connection becomes necessary or convenient during the term of this Agreement, Consultant shall not make any such connection without first obtaining the express written consent of the County's Information Technology Director and executing and delivering to the County copy of the County's then-current Information Technology Usage Agreement.

AUDIT.

Consultant shall maintain complete and accurate records with respect to costs incurred and services performed under this Agreement for a period of at least six (6) years after the termination of this Agreement. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 16C.05, Subd. 5, Consultant shall allow the County or other persons or agencies authorized by the County, including the Legislative or State Auditor, access to the records of Consultant at reasonable hours, including all books, records, documents, and accounting procedures and practices of Consultant relevant to the subject matter of the Agreement, for purposes of audit.

10. NOTICE.

Any notices required or permitted to be given under this Agreement: (i) shall be in writing signed by or on behalf of the party making the same; (ii) shall be deemed given or delivered (a) if delivered personally, when received, (b) if sent from within the United States by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, on the third business day after mailing, or (c) if sent by messenger or reputable overnight courier service, on the next business day after mailing; and (iii) shall be addressed to each party at its address set forth in this Agreement, or at such other address as the parties shall designate in writing by personal delivery, certified mail, or overnight courier service.

11. **DISPUTES**.

The County's Authorized Representative will be the initial interpreter of the requirements of this Agreement and will determine the acceptability of the work to be provided hereunder. All claims, disputes and other matters relating to the acceptability of the work must be referred to the County's Authorized Representative in writing

with a request that a formal decision be made within a reasonable period of time. Written notice of each claim, dispute or other matter must be delivered to the County's Authorized Representative within 30 days of the occurrence of the event giving rise to the claim, dispute or other matter. All data supporting the claim, dispute or other matter must be submitted to the County's Authorized Representative within 45 days of the event, unless the County's Authorized Representative allows for additional time based on the availability of complete and accurate data. The Consultant shall continue to perform while the claim or dispute is pending. The issuance of a decision by the County's Authorized Representative shall be a condition precedent to the Consultant's exercise of the rights and remedies the Consultant may have under this Agreement or at law with respect to the claim, dispute or other matter.

12. TERMINATION AND SUSPENSION.

- 12.1 County Termination and Suspension with Cause. This Agreement may be suspended or terminated by the County if the Consultant violates any of the terms or conditions of this Agreement as determined by the County. In the event the County exercises its right to suspend or terminate this Agreement, the County shall submit written notice to the Consultant specifying the extent of the suspension or termination and the reasons therefore, and the date upon which suspension or termination becomes effective.
- 12.2 <u>County Termination and Suspension without Cause</u>. The County may terminate this Agreement without cause by giving at least 30 days written notice to the Consultant. Upon receipt of a notice of such termination, the Consultant shall take all action necessary to discontinue work or further commit County funds.
- 12.3 <u>Consultant Termination with Cause</u>. This Agreement may be terminated by the Consultant if the County violates any of the terms or conditions of this Agreement as determined by the Consultant. In the event the Consultant exercises its right to terminate this Agreement, the Consultant shall submit written notice to the County specifying the reasons therefore, and the date upon which termination becomes effective.
- 12. 4 Consultant Termination without Cause. The Consultant may terminate this Agreement without cause by giving at least 30 days written notice to the County. Upon County's receipt of a notice of such termination, the Consultant shall cease all work on the Project and provide all documents pertaining to the Project to the County as soon as is reasonably feasible, but not longer than five (5) business dates from the County's receipt of the notice of termination.
- 12.5 <u>Payment upon Termination and Suspension with or without Cause</u>. The Consultant shall be entitled to payment for all work satisfactorily performed up to the day the termination or suspension takes effect, as determined by the County.

13. SURVIVAL.

The provisions of this Agreement which, by their terms, impose obligations that are continuing in nature and which must survive in order to give effect to their meaning will survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement, including, without limitation, the following clauses: Sections 2.5 (Standard of Care and Liability for Work); 7 (Insurance and Indemnification); 8 (Records and Information); 9 (Audit); 14.3 (Governing Law; Jurisdiction; Venue).

14, GENERAL PROVISIONS.

14.1 Entire Agreement; Amendments; Conflicts. This Agreement (including the exhibits attached hereto) constitutes the entire agreement and understanding of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous agreements, documents and proposals, oral or written, between the parties with respect thereto. Any amendment or modification to this Agreement shall not be valid unless such amendment or modification (i) is in writing and signed by authorized representatives of both parties and (ii)

references this Agreement. The terms and conditions of the exhibits are integral parts of this Agreement and are fully incorporated herein by this reference.

- 14.2 <u>Compliance with Applicable Law</u>. The Consultant agrees to comply with applicable federal, state and local laws or ordinances, and applicable rules, regulations, and standards established by any agency of such governmental units, which are now or hereafter promulgated insofar as they relate to the Consultant's performance of the provisions of this Agreement. It shall be the obligation of the Consultant to maintain, pay for and obtain all licenses required by any governmental agency for the provision of those services contemplated herein.
- 14.3 Governing Law; Jurisdiction; Venue. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Minnesota, without regard to its conflict of laws rules. For the purpose of resolving conflicts related to or arising out of this Agreement, the parties expressly agree that venue shall be exclusively in the State of Minnesota, County of Redwood. The parties hereby expressly consent to the exclusive personal jurisdiction of the federal and state courts located in the State of Minnesota, regardless of the citizenship or residency of either party at the time of the commencement of any legal proceeding.
- 14.4 <u>Debarment</u>. Consultant certifies that it is not prohibited from doing business with either the federal government or the State of Minnesota as a result of any debarment or suspension proceedings. Consultant's certification is a material representation upon which the County's approval of this Agreement is based. Consultant shall provide immediate written notice to the County's authorized representative if at any time Consultant learns that this certification is erroneous or becomes erroneous due to changed circumstances.
- 14.5 <u>Conflict of Interest.</u> The Consultant affirms that, to the best of the Consultant's knowledge, the Consultant's involvement in this Agreement does not result in a conflict of interest with any party or entity, which may be affected by the terms of this Agreement. The Consultant agrees that, should any conflict or potential conflict of interest become known to the Consultant, it will immediately notify the County of the conflict or potential conflict, specifying the part of this Agreement giving rise to the conflict or potential conflict, and will advise the County whether the Consultant will or will not resign from the other engagement or representation.
- 14.6 <u>Assignment and Delegation</u>. Neither party shall assign its rights or delegate its duties under this Agreement without receiving the prior written consent of the other party.
- 14.7 <u>Successors in Interest</u>. The provisions of this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their permitted successors and assigns.
- 14.8 <u>Severability</u>. In the event that any portion of this Agreement shall be held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Agreement.
- 14.9 <u>Execution</u>. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and to constitute one and the same instrument. Electronic copies of this Agreement, including without limitation, those transmitted by facsimile or scanned to an image file, shall be considered originals.

PROJECT SCHEDULE

The Consultant will provide the County with the services in **Exhibit A** beginning upon the Effective Date and will terminate the earlier of two years from the Effective Date or completion of project.

EXHIBIT C

COMPENSATION

The County shall pay Consultant \$53,000 for the performance of the services in **Exhibit A** pursuant to the terms and conditions of section 4. <u>PAYMENT TO CONSULTANT</u> of the Agreement. Any additional expenses, will require preapproval by the County's Authorized Representative prior to incurring the expense.

EXHIBIT D

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Consultant shall procure and maintain for the duration of the Agreement, insurance coverage for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder by Consultant.

- 1. <u>Minimum Scope of Insurance</u>: Coverage shall be at least as broad as follows:
 - a. General Liability coverage (occurrence form CG 00 01 or a substitute form providing equivalent coverage), and shall cover liability arising from premises, operations, independent contractors, products-completed operations, personal injury, advertising, and liability assumed under an insured contract (including the tort liability of another assumed in a business contract).
 - b. Automobile Liability coverage shall be written on ISO form CA 00 01, CA 00 05, CA 00 12, CA 00 20, or substitute for providing equivalent liability coverage. Such insurance shall cover liability arising out of any auto (including owned, hired, and non-owned autos).
 - c. Workers' Compensation as required by the State of Minnesota, and Employer's Liability insurance. If the Consultant's employment is an excluded employment under Minn. Stat. § 176.041 and the Consultant elects not to purchase workers' compensation coverage, the Consultant shall provide the County with a written waiver of workers' compensation coverage in a form acceptable to the County. The Consultant agrees that under no circumstances shall the County be responsible for workers' compensation for injuries suffered in connection with this Agreement.
- 2. <u>Minimum Limits of Insurance</u>: Consultant shall maintain **NO LESS THAN** the following limits of insurance:
 - a. General Liability Insurance, and if necessary, Umbrella Liability:
 - \$2,000,000 annual aggregate
 - \$2,000,000 Umbrella Policy
 - b. Business Automobile Liability and if necessary, Umbrella Liability:
 - \$1,000,000 per occurrence
 - \$2,000,000 Umbrella Policy
 - c. Employers Liability:
 - as required by the State of Minnesota
 - d. Professional/Technical Liability or Directors and Officers:
 - \$250,000 per occurrence Employee Dishonesty
 - \$2,000,000 Umbrella Policy
- Deductibles and Self-Insurance:
 - a. Any deductibles will be the sole responsibility of the Consultant and may not exceed \$50,000 without the written consent of the County. Any request for a higher deductible must first be approved by the County after Consultant provides the County with financial documentation sufficient for the County to determine whether Consultant has the financial resources to cover the requested deductible.
- 4. Additional Insurance Conditions:

- a. Consultant's insurance shall apply as primary insurance with respect to any other insurance or self-insurance program maintained by the County. The County's insurance or self-insurance program shall be excess of Consultant's insurance and shall not contribute to it.
- b. Any failure to comply with reporting provisions of the policies shall not affect coverage provided to the NCDA or its officers, officials, employees or volunteers.
- c. Consultant must obtain insurance policies from insurance companies having an "AM BEST" rating of A:VII or better and authorized to do business in the State of Minnesota.

Verification of Coverage:

Consultant shall provide the County with certificates of insurance and original endorsements showing that the Consultant has each type of insurance coverage and limits required under this Agreement. All certificates and endorsements are to be received and approved by the County before work commences.
